A German manufacturer that's more than 300 years old is adding 30,000 square feet onto its Lowcountry plant. Zapp Precision Wire, Inc plans to invest \$30 million and create 20 jobs as part of the Summerville expansion, the state Commerce Department said Thursday. The company makes wire from stainless steel, nickel alloys and titanium wire.

**Note:** "Over the next several years, we will break ground for a new building addition and install the steel-working equipment needed to produce precision metallic bars," Zapp Group executive board member Stefan Seng said in a statement issued by Gov. Nikki Haley's office.

After eight years and three failed attempts to sell, the South Carolina Ports Authority has finally reached an agreement to sell its old port in Port Royal. The authority board on Tuesday approved the sale to Furman Investment Advisory Services of Greenville for \$15.4 million.

**Note:** Three previous attempts to sell fell through, and Gov. Nikki Haley signed legislation earlier this year that required the property to be auctioned unless it was sold by next June.

South Carolina’s roads are in such bad shape that the chief of Michelin North America thinks his company might have to consider other locations for expansion. The company has become the state’s largest manufacturing employer with nearly 8,000 workers at its Greenville headquarters and seven plants, including two in Lexington County.

**Note:** Last year, the Legislature passed and Gov. Nikki Haley signed a bill that commits more than \$600 million for building and repairing roads and bridges. It was the first increase in state funding for highways in nearly three decades.

The U.S. Supreme Court on Thursday refused to block gay marriages in South Carolina but Attorney General Alan Wilson said the issue is still not settled. The court denied Wilson’s request to prevent the marriages while he appeals last week’s decision by a federal judge tossing out the state constitutional ban on gay marriage.

Defying Republicans and bypassing Congress, President Barack Obama prepared to invoke his executive authority Thursday night to spare nearly 5 million people in the U.S. illegally from deportation. Millions more will remain in limbo.
