- WHEREAS,** people with mental illnesses can recover if given the necessary services and support in their communities; and
- WHEREAS,** only one out of two people with a serious form of mental illness seeks treatment; and
- WHEREAS,** stigma and fear of discrimination keep many who would benefit from mental health services from seeking help; and
- WHEREAS,** greater public awareness about mental illnesses can help change negative attitudes and behaviors toward people with mental illnesses; and
- WHEREAS,** the 2015 observance of Mental Health Month will help raise awareness of mental health and the stigma people with mental illness face while delivering the message that, with proper treatment, recovery is possible.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Nikki R. Haley, Governor of the great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim May 2015 as

throughout the state and encourage all South Carolinians to work together to increase understanding of mental illness and to raise awareness of the need for appropriate and accessible mental health services.
