Thank you for contacting me with your concerns regarding the recent Department of Education guidance on school restrooms. I appreciate your input on this matter and the opportunity to share my thoughts with you.

As you may know, the Department of Education and the Department of Justice issued a Dear Colleague letter on May 13, 2015 which re-interpreted the meaning of "gender" under Title IX of the Education Amendments Act. The letter states that the Department of Education will withhold federal funding from any school that does not comply with their interpretation of Title IX. This new interpretation includes allowing students to use the bathroom of their choosing.

In response to their letter, I joined twenty four of my Senate colleagues in sending a letter to the Department of Education and Department of Justice expressing our concerns with this interpretation of Title IX. The letter states that these agencies do not have the right to issue "guidance" as if it were the law and then withhold Congressionally authorized funding from schools for violations. Furthermore, it clarifies that federal law does not

require schools to follow guidance issued by the Department of Education.

I believe that every student, regardless of race or gender, deserves the opportunity to learn in a safe and welcoming environment. Threats to withhold funding diminishes that opportunity and places our nation's poorest students at risk. This is yet another example of the Obama administration overstepping the role of the federal government. I believe that this issue is one that is best determined by states and school boards; not by the federal government.
