A vote by South Carolina's economic advisers has provided legislators an additional \$300 million in discretionary spending. The Board of Economic Advisors voted unanimously Friday to recognize a total of \$415 million in higher-than-previously-expected revenues. But \$37.5 million of that must go toward property tax relief, and \$75.5 million is limited by law to certain expenses, primarily college scholarships and K-12 education.
