Certified birth certificate issued by the city, county or state <p>NOTE: A certified birth certificate has a registrar's raised, embossed, impressed or multicolored seal, registrar's signature, and the date the certificate was filed with the registrar's office, which must be within 1 year of your birth. As such, the passport card is adjudicated to the exact standards as the passport book. DHS notes that most States already query the Social Security Administration (SSA) database to match SSN through the SSOLV (Social Security On-Line Verification) system, and some States also use batch methods to query the SSA.</p> <p>Other verification systems required include: a State-to-State agency data exchange system, the DHS SAVE/SEVIS (Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements Student and Exchange Visitor Information System), the Department of State (DOS) query system, and the EVVE (Electronic Verification of Vital Events) system. Those</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • with family living or traveling abroad • thinking about a vacation abroad, or • with a job that could require international travel. 	<p>The passport card will facilitate entry and expedite document processing at U.S. land and sea ports-of-entry when arriving from Canada, Mexico, the Caribbean and Bermuda. The card may not be used to travel by air. It will otherwise carry the rights and privileges of the U.S. passport.</p>	<p>The EDL/ID meets federal requirements, and is an approved alternative to a passport for re-entry into the U.S at land and sea borders between the U.S., Canada, Mexico, Bermuda, and the Caribbean under The Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative (WHTI).</p>	<p>Under current rules, a REAL ID compliant license will be required for accessing a Federal facility; boarding Federally-regulated commercial aircraft; and entering nuclear power plants. Current rules indicate that a REAL ID compliant license will NOT be acceptable as a border crossing document.</p>
