

Latest Trends from the SREB-State Data Exchange

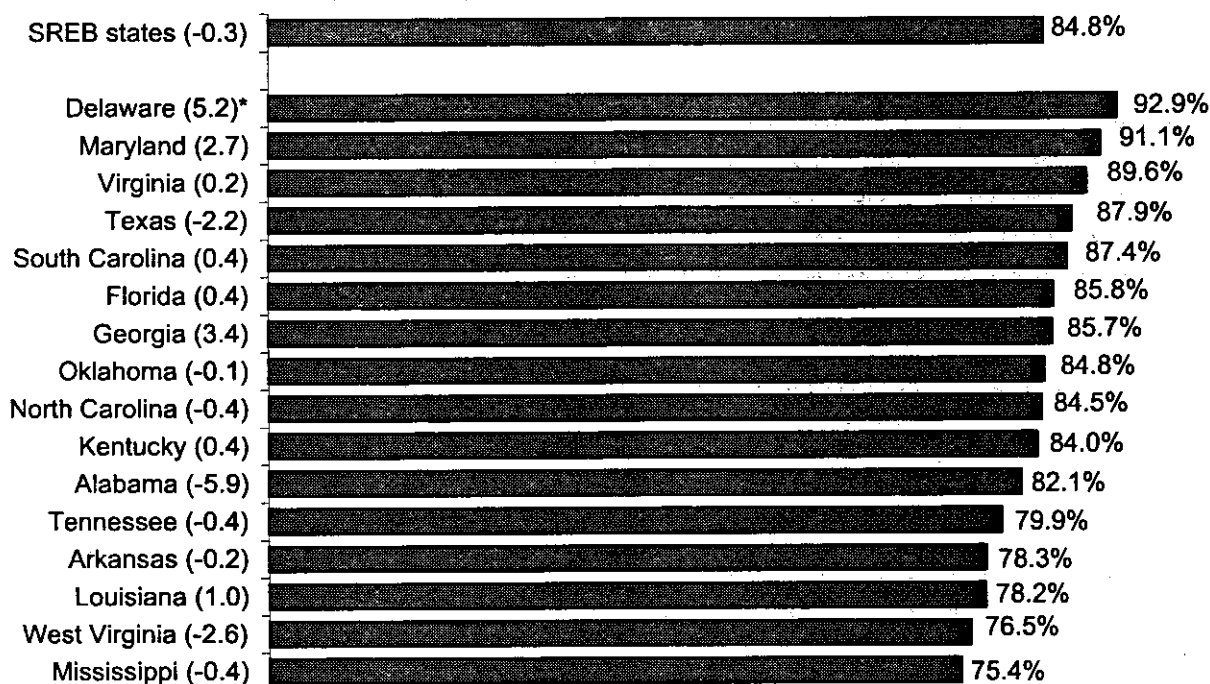

First-Year Students Staying in and Completing College

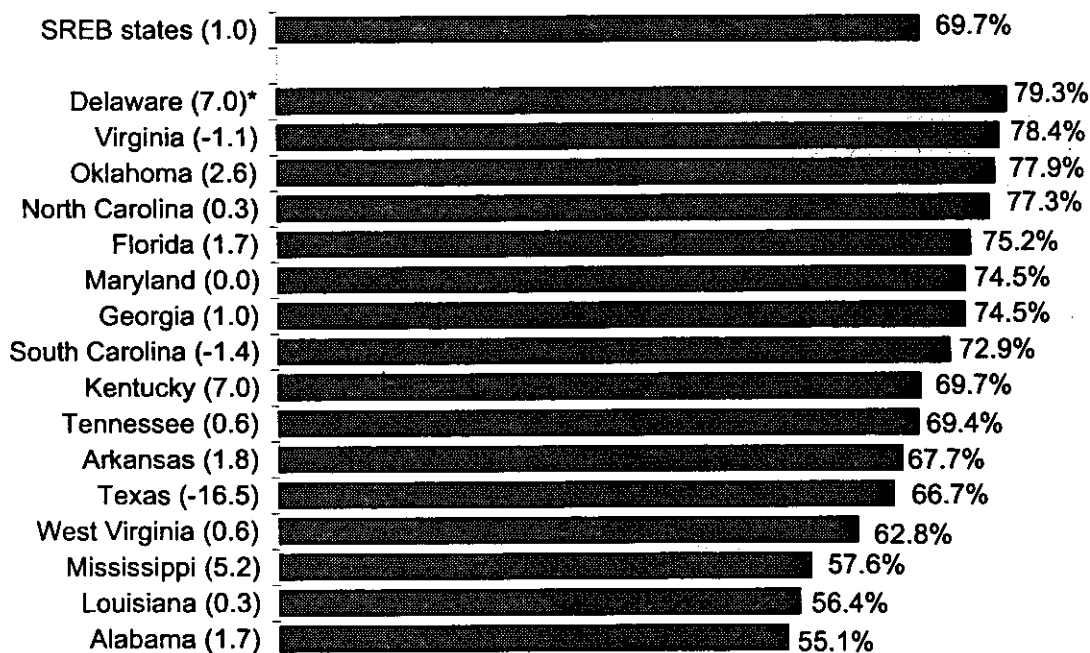
First-Year Student Persistence Rates, 2001 Cohort

(point change from 1996 cohort shown in parentheses)

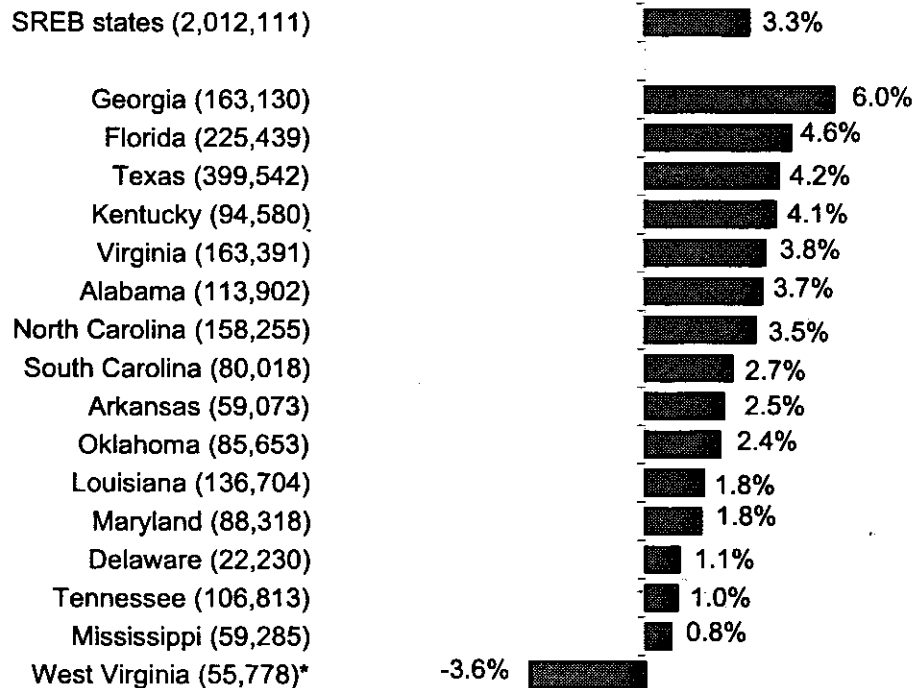

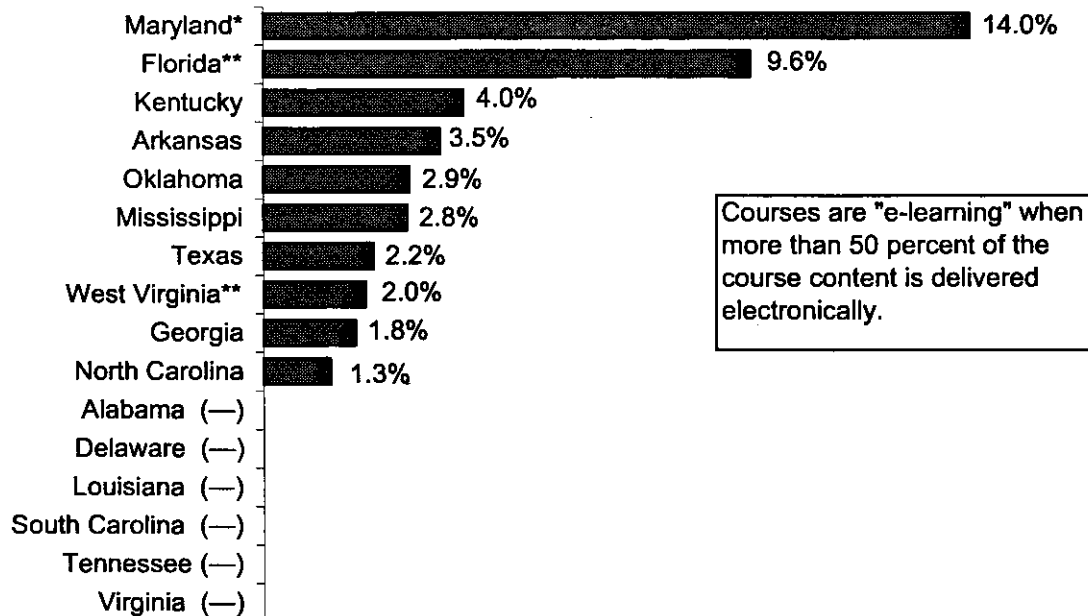
Public Four-Year Colleges and Universities Full-Time-Equivalent Enrollments and e-Learning

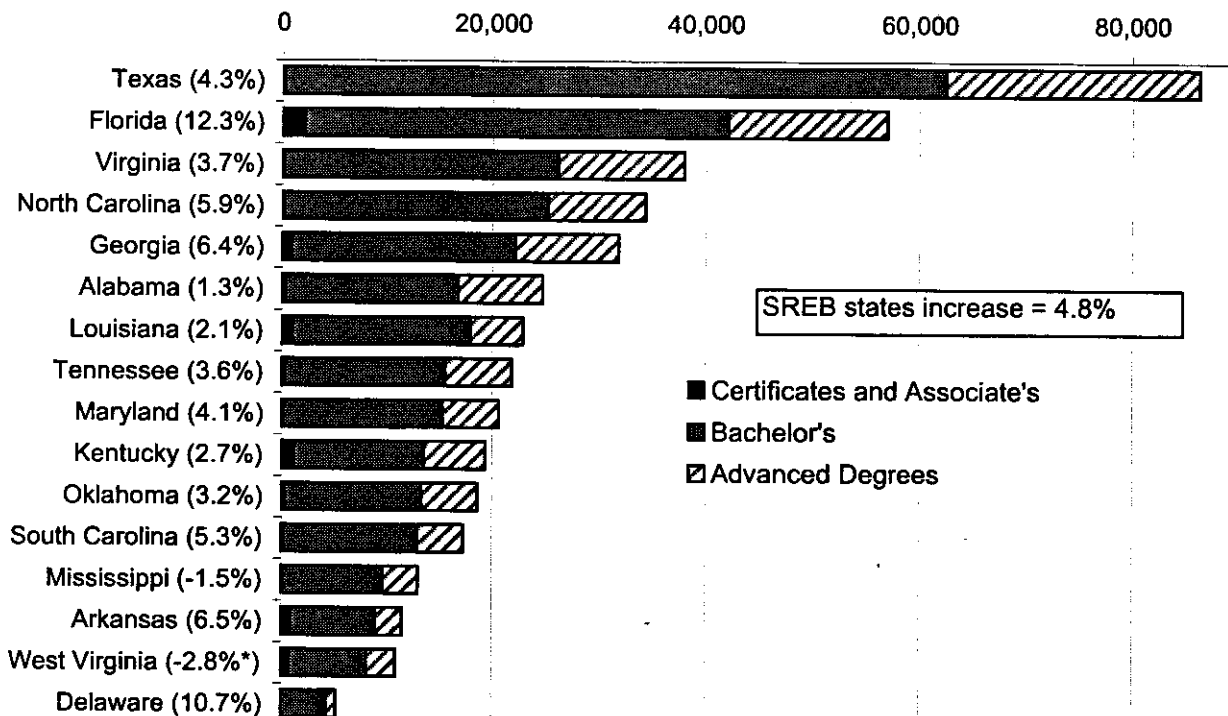

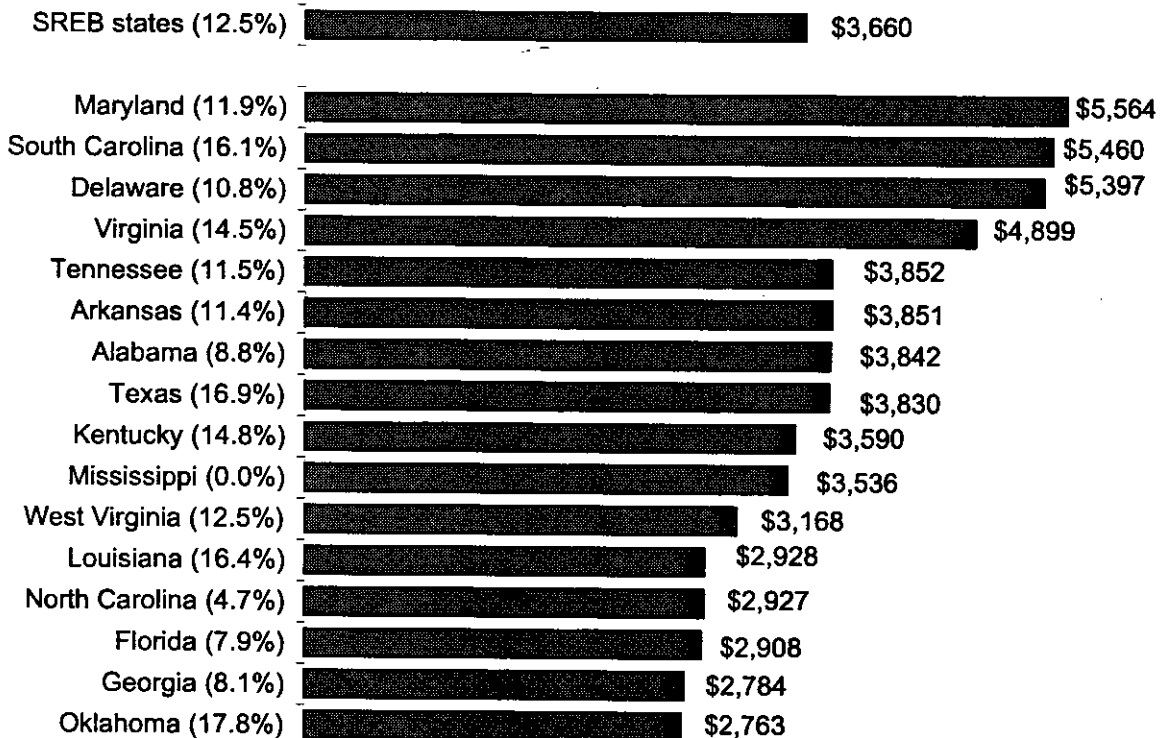
Degrees and Other Awards Conferred, 2002-03

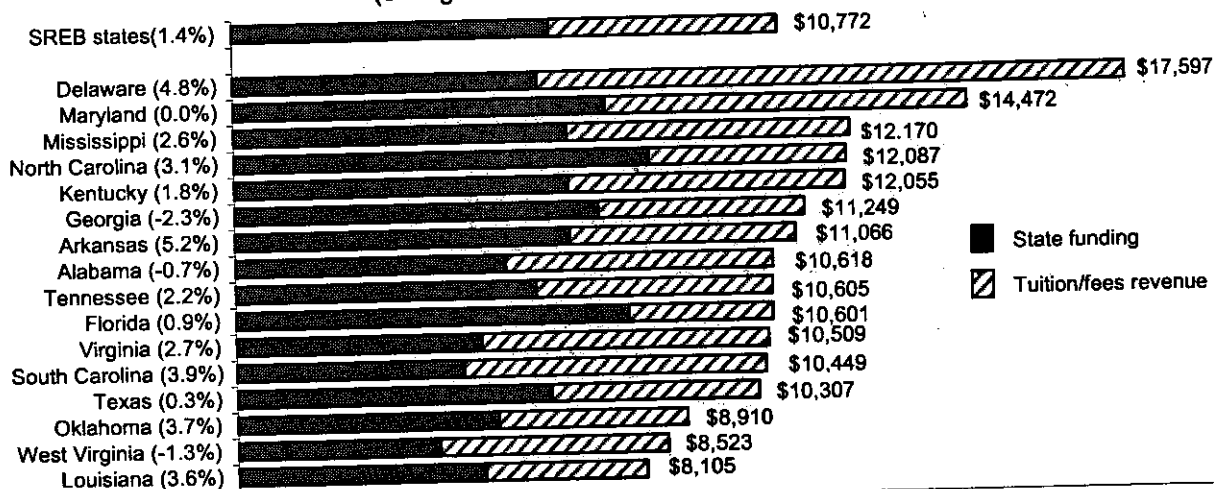
Annual Tuition and Required Fees for In-State Undergraduates, 2003-04 (increase from 2002-03 shown in parentheses)



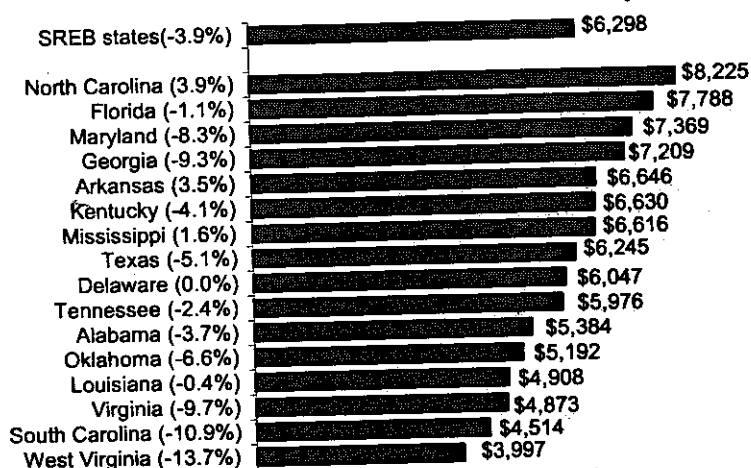

Public Funding for Campus Operations per Full-Time-Equivalent Student

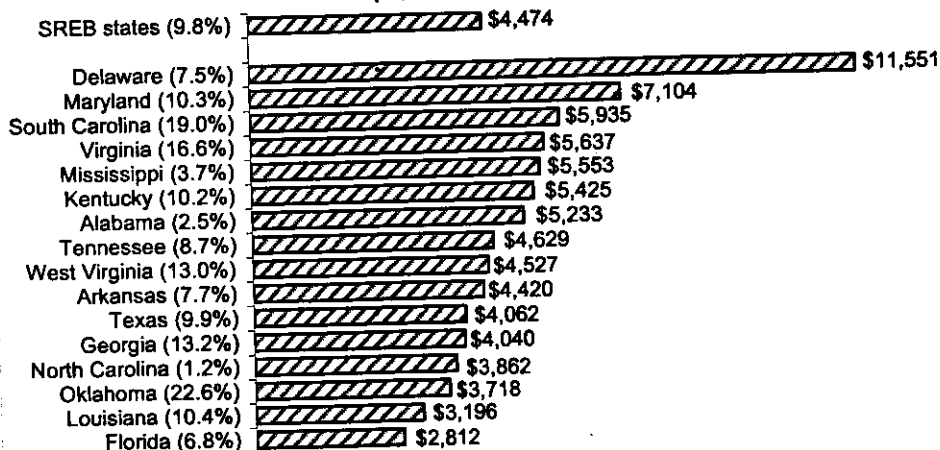
Total Public Funding per FTE Student, 2003-04

(change from 2002-03 shown in parentheses)



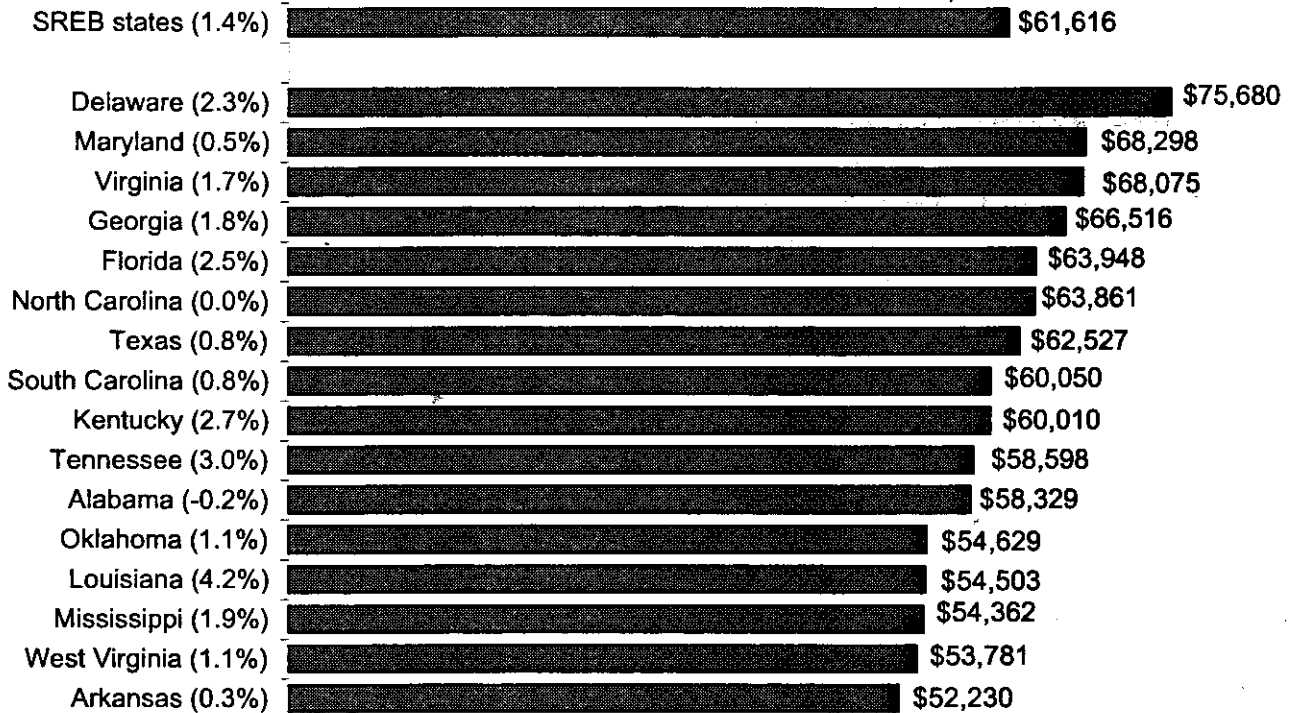
Tuition and Fees Revenue per FTE Student, 2003-04

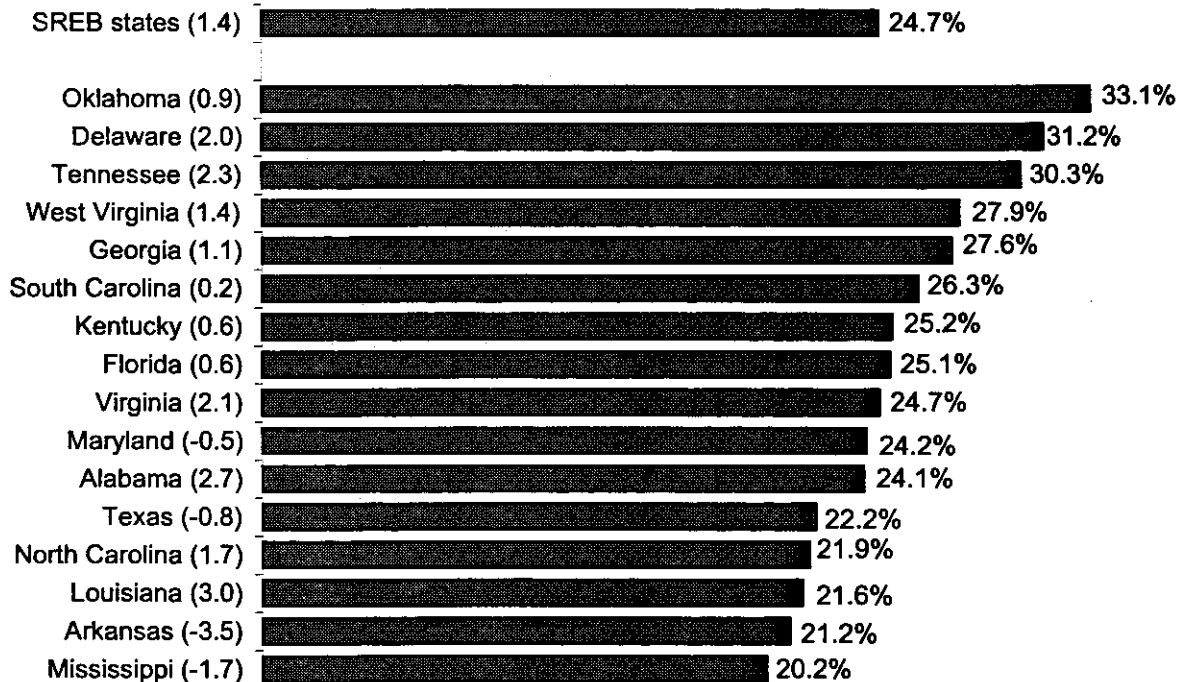
Faculty Salaries and Benefits

Additional Benefits for Full-Time Faculty as a Percent of Salary, 2003-04

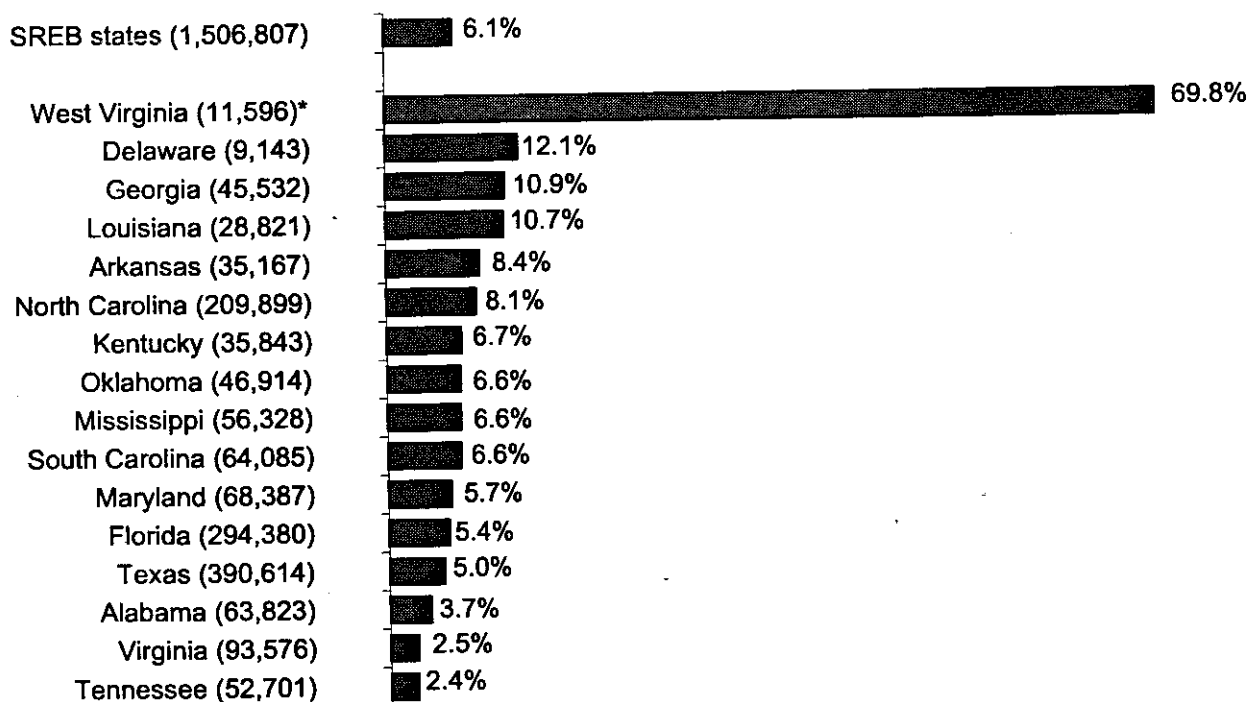

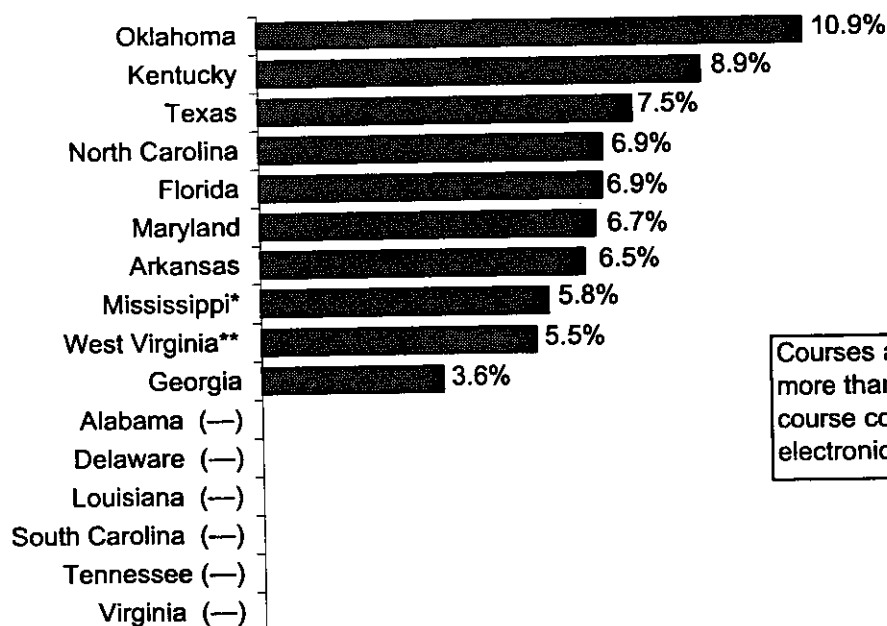
Full-Time-Equivalent Enrollments and e-Learning

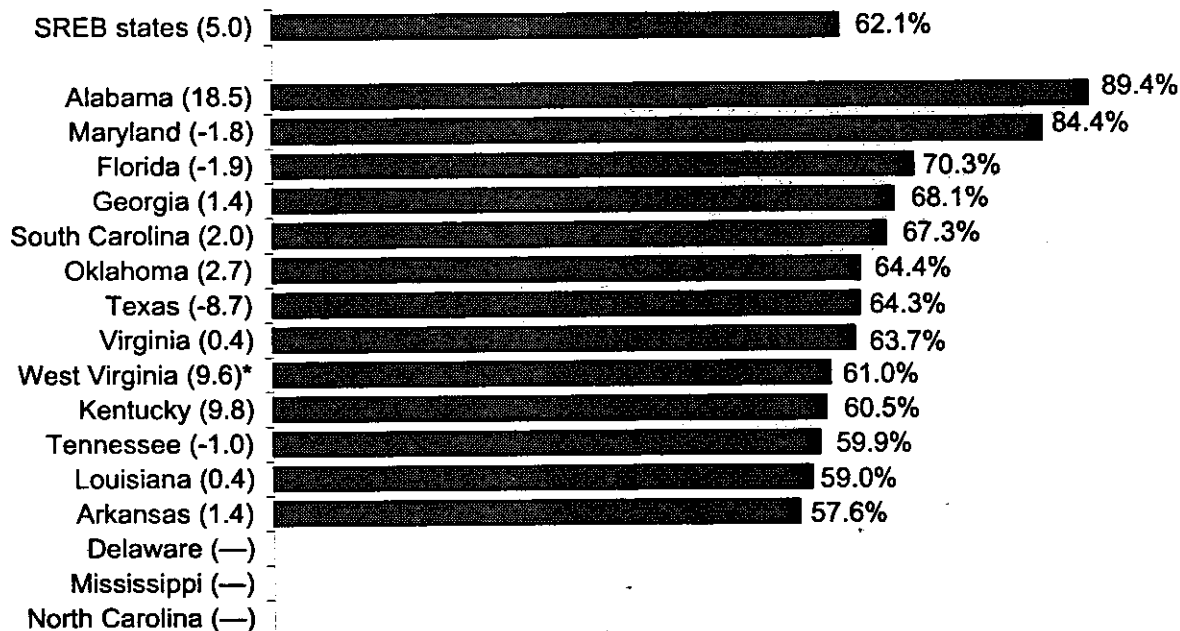

First-Year Student Persistence Rates, 2001 Cohort (point change from 2000 cohort shown in parentheses)

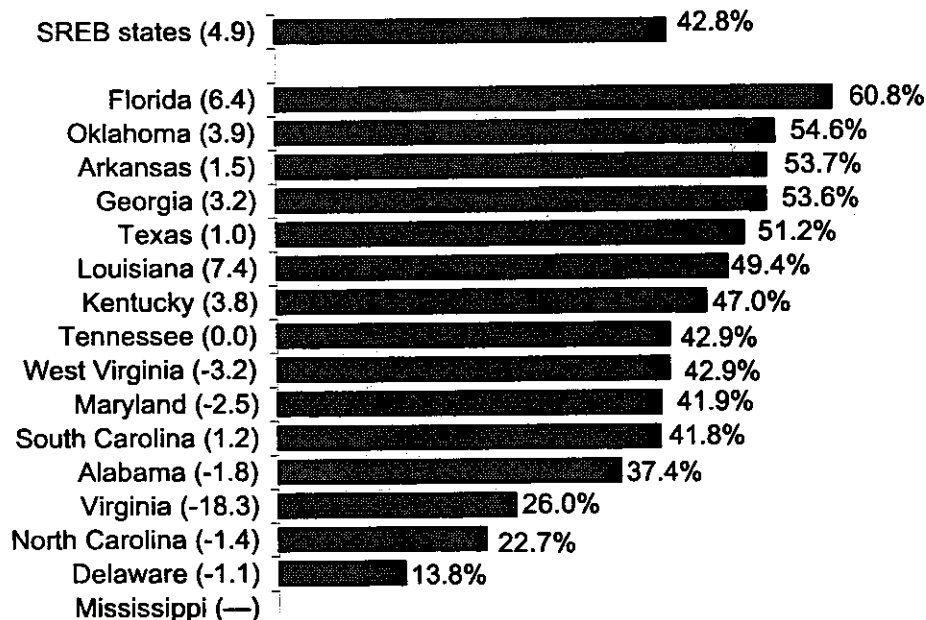

Three-Year Progression Rates of Full-Time Students, 2000 Cohort (point change from 1999 cohort shown in parentheses)



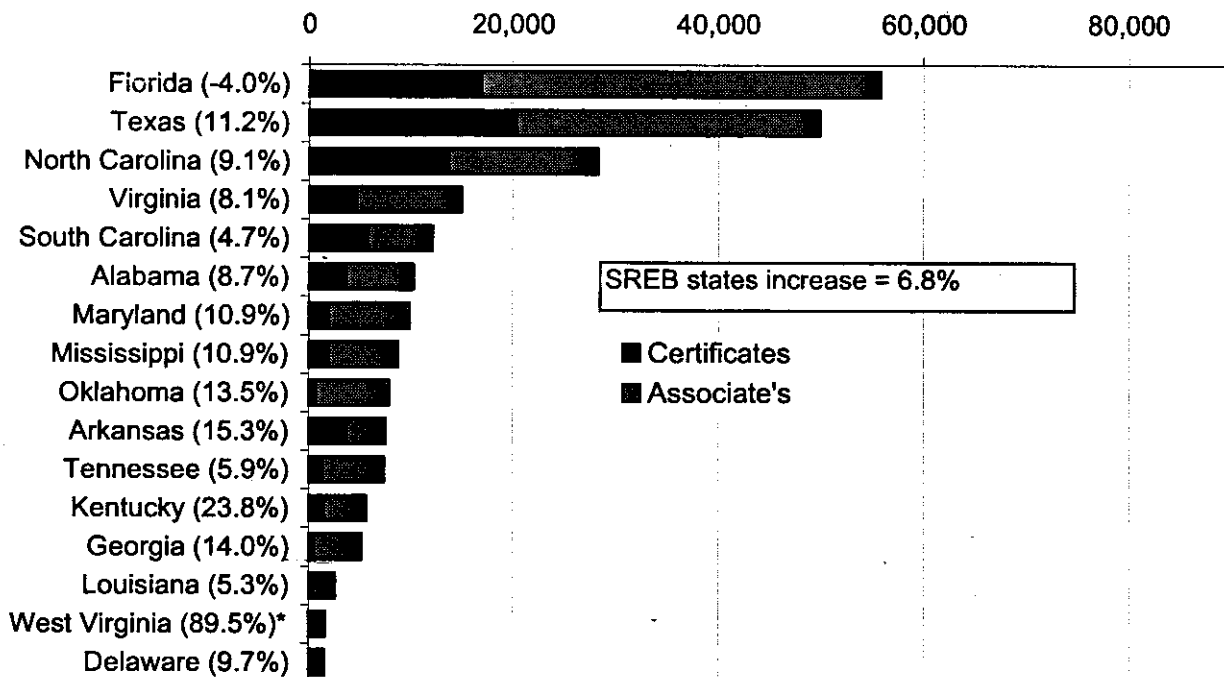

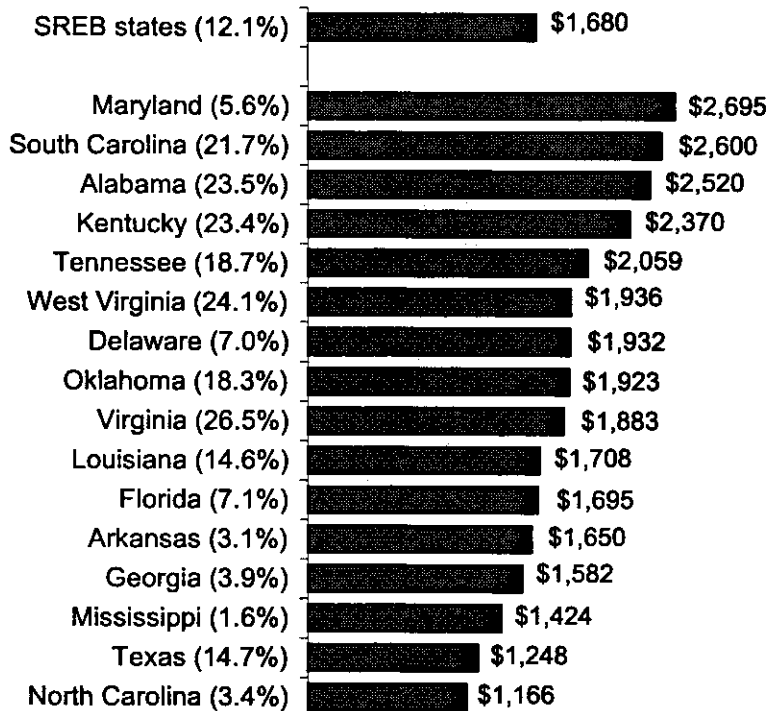
Degrees Conferred and Tuition/Fees Charged

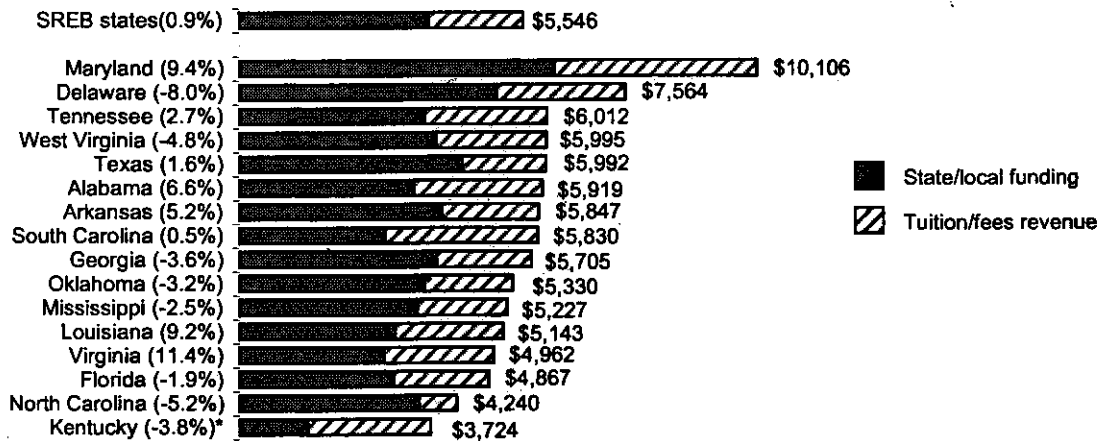
Annual Tuition and Required Fees for In-State Undergraduates, 2003-04 (increase from 2002-03 shown in parentheses)

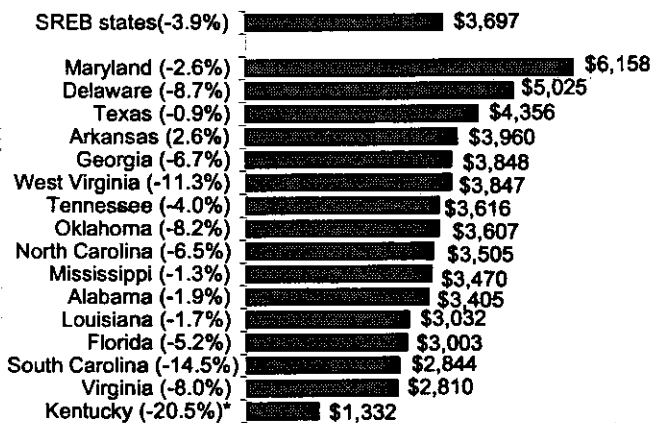
Public Funding for Campus Operations per Full-Time-Equivalent Student

Total Public Funding per FTE Student, 2003-04 (change from 2002-03 shown in parentheses)



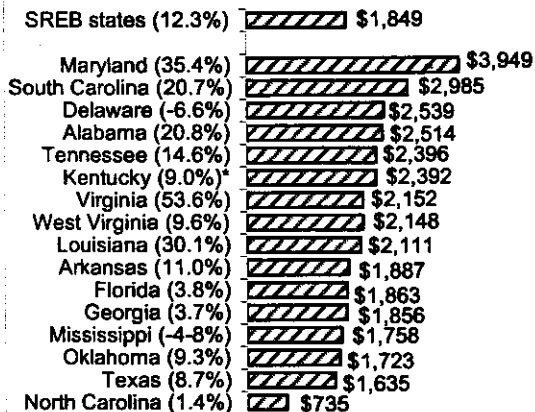

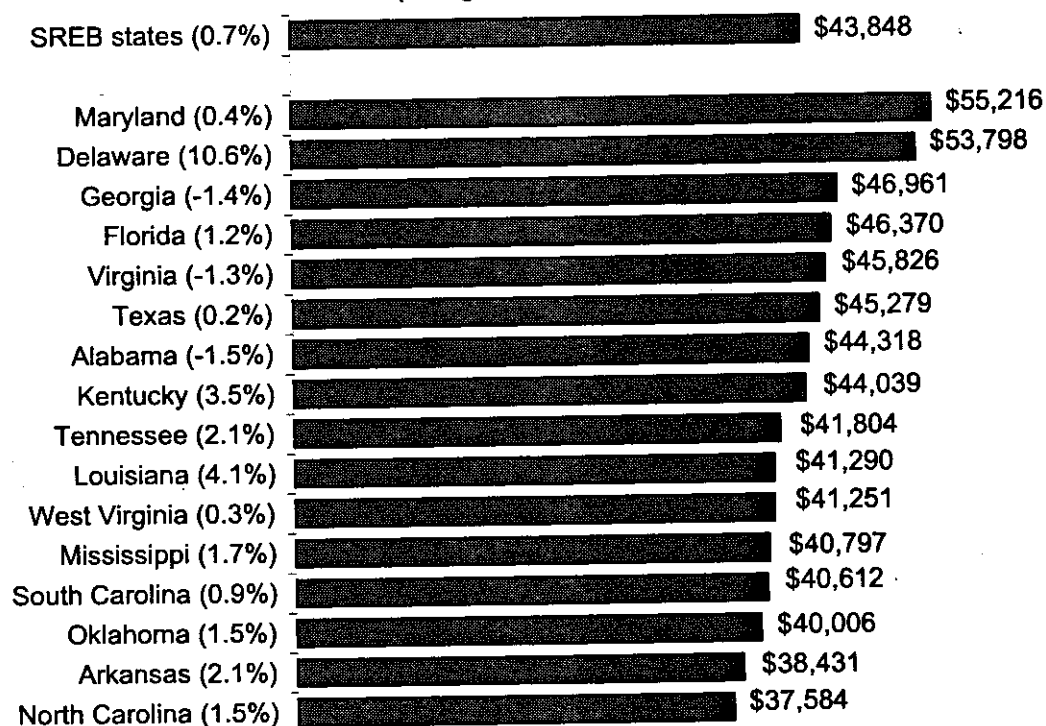
Tuition and Fees Revenue per FTE Student, 2003-04 (increase from 2002-03 shown in parentheses)



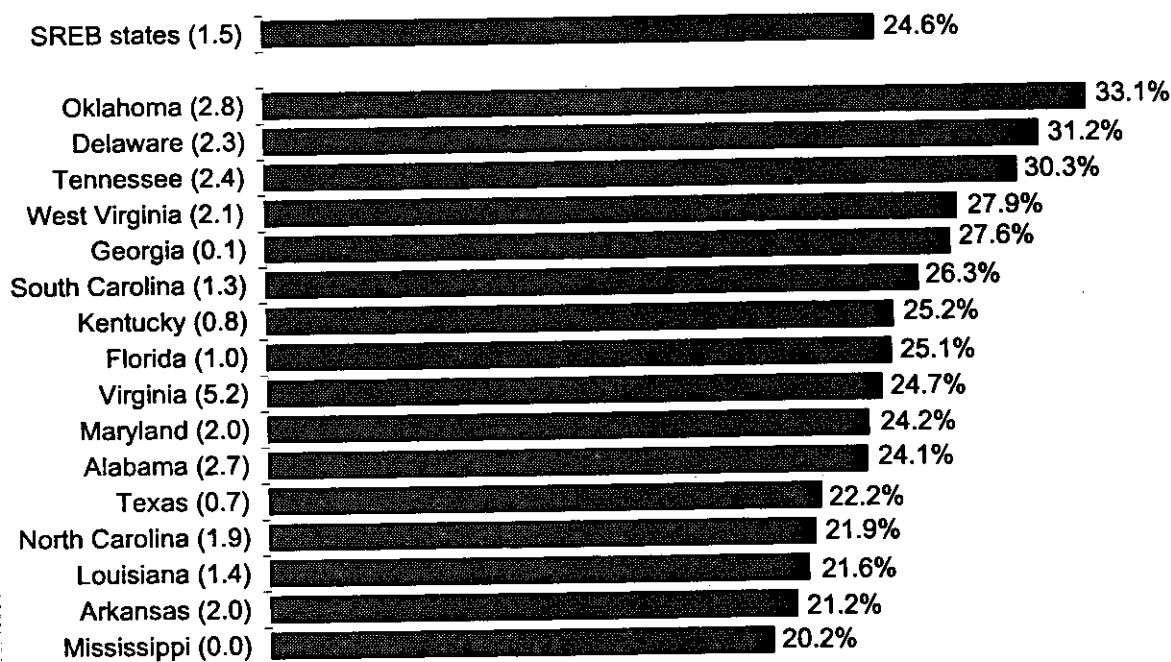

All Ranks Full-Time Faculty Salaries, 2003-04 (change from 2002-03 shown in parentheses)

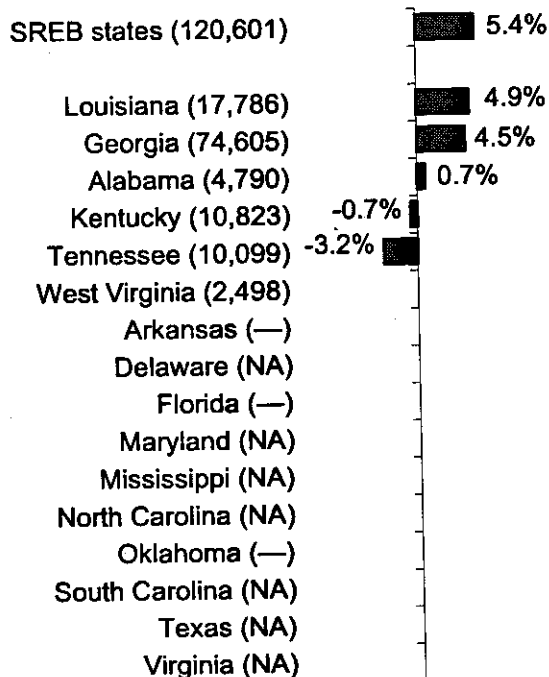


Additional Benefits for Full-Time Faculty as a Percent of Salary, 2003-04 (point change from 2002-03 shown in parentheses)

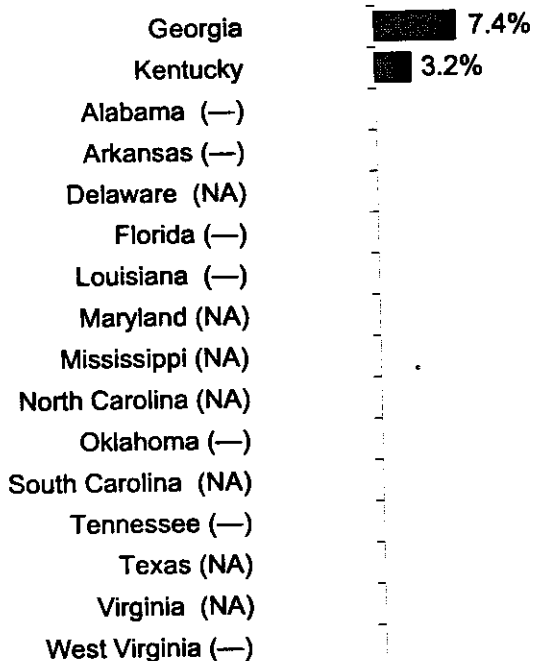
Changes in Full-Time-Equivalent Enrollment, 2002-03 to 2003-04 (2003-04 levels shown in parentheses)

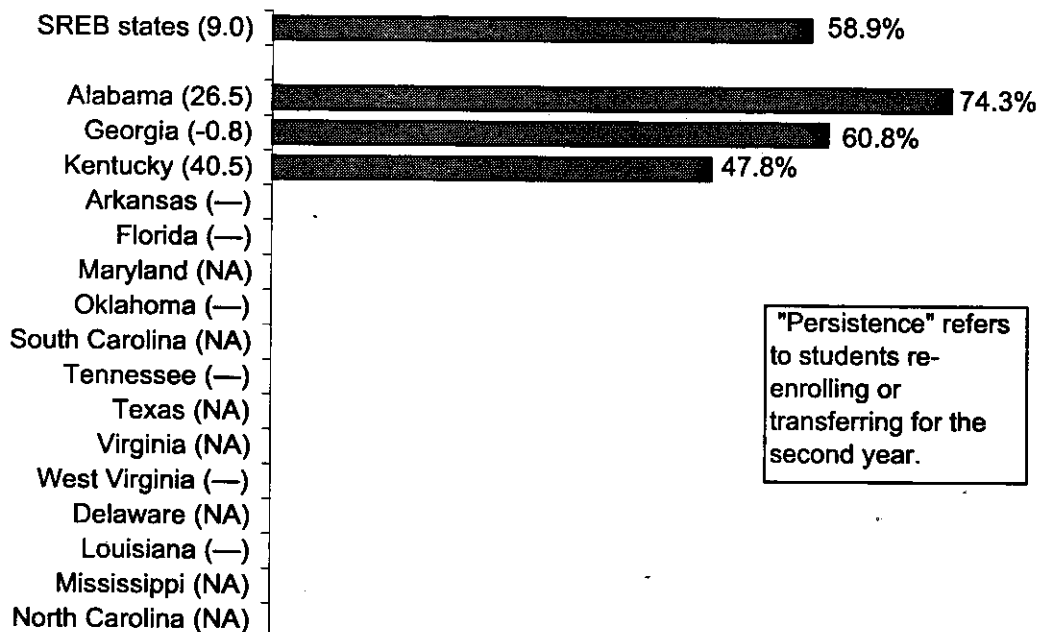

First-Year Student Persistence Rates, 2001 Cohort (point change from 2000 cohort shown in parentheses)

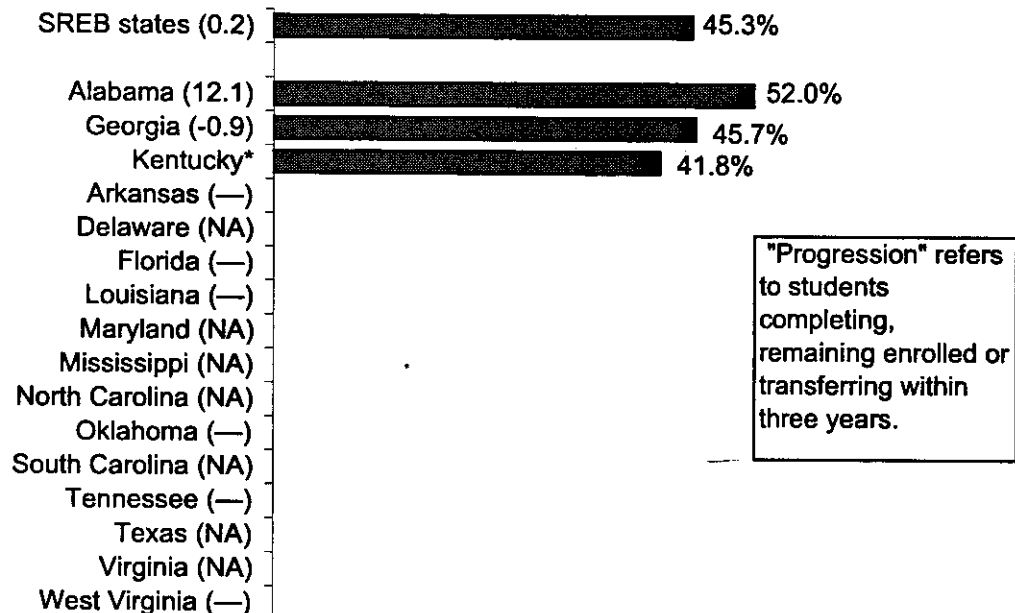

Progression Rates of Full-Time Students, 2000 Cohort (point change from 1999 cohort shown in parentheses)



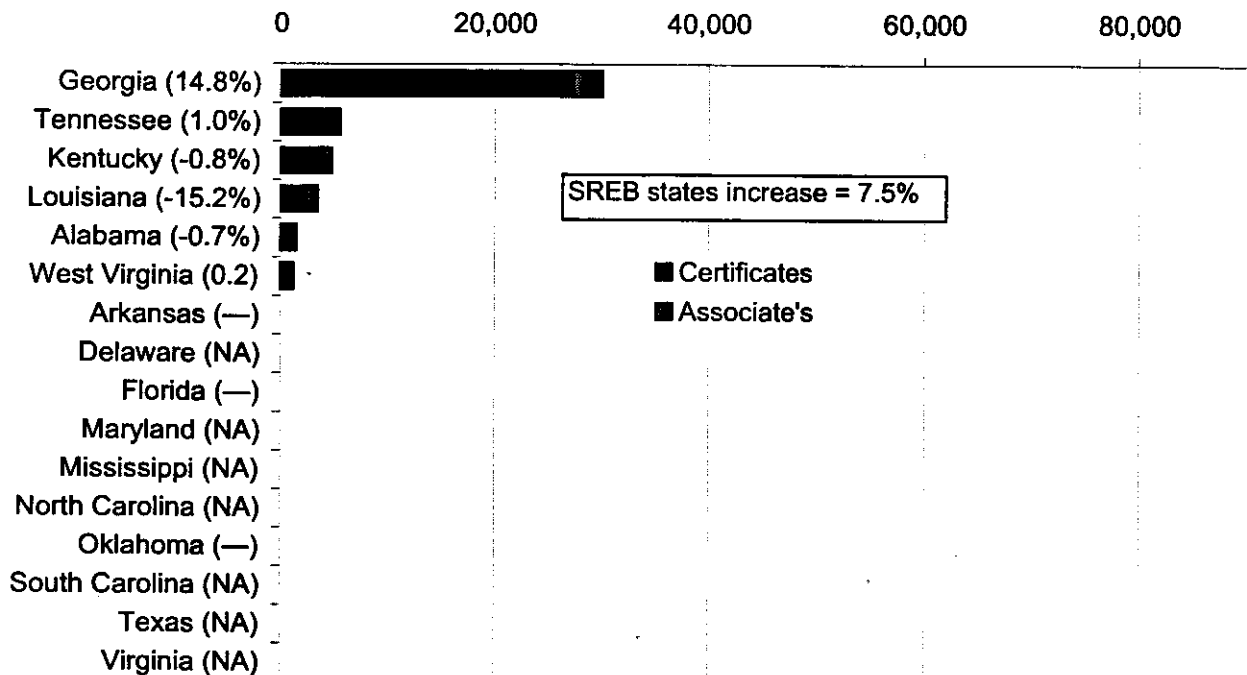

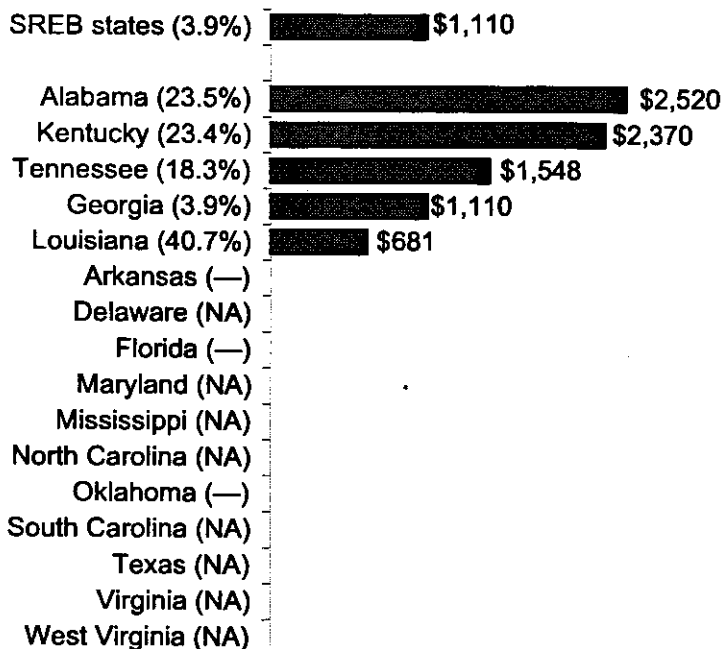

Annual Tuition and Required Fees for In-State Undergraduates, 2003-04 (increase from 2002-03 shown in parentheses)



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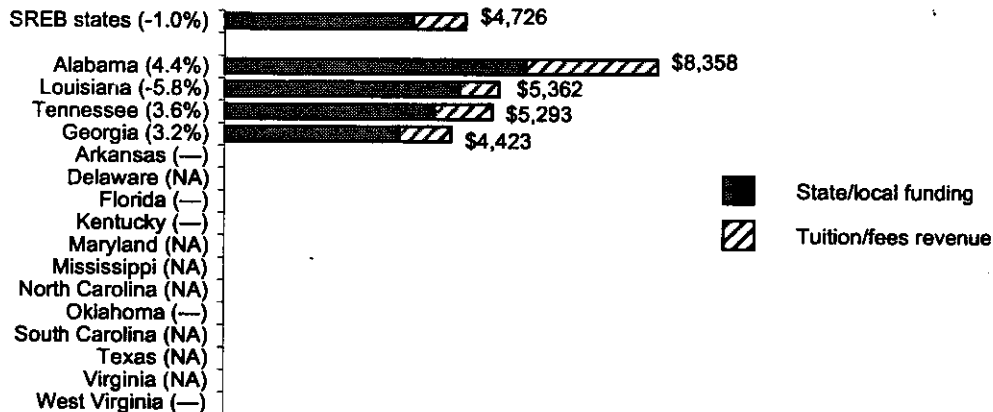

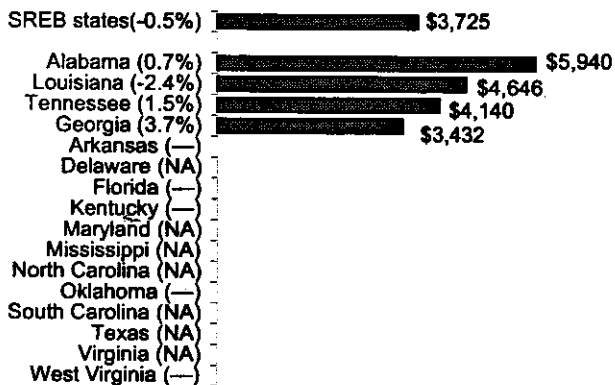

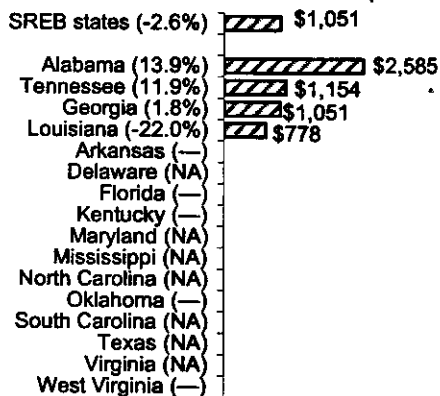

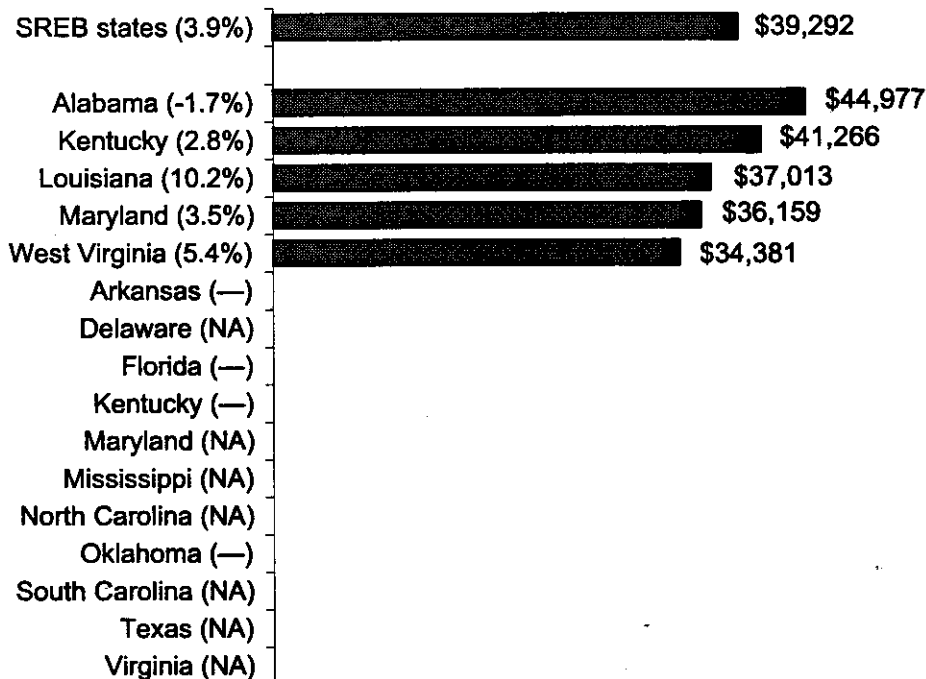

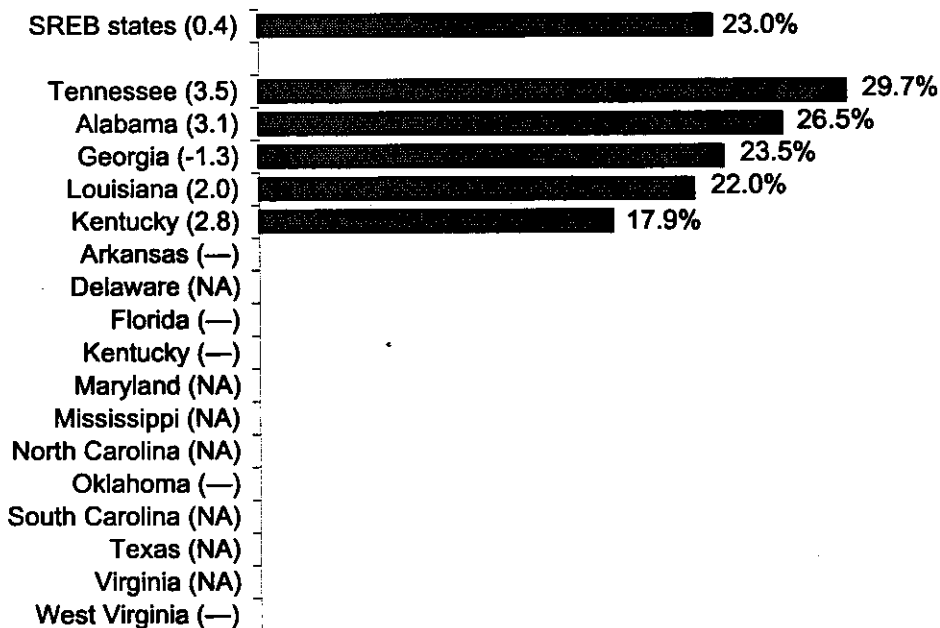
Full-Time Faculty Salaries, 2003-04 (change from 2002-03 shown in parentheses)

Graphs	Additional Data Elements
Total FTE Enrollment	FTE enrollments for undergraduate and graduate instruction are reported separately.
Percent of Undergraduate Instructional Activity Through e-Learning	Undergraduate and graduate student credit hours through traditional classroom instruction (on- and off-campus) are reported separately, as well as subcategories of e-learning and those from correspondence courses, if any.
First-Year Persistence Rates	Still-enrolled and transfer rates are reported separately.
Progression Rates (150% of normal time)	Completion, still-enrolled and transfer rates are reported separately; six-year completion rates for two-year schools and 10-year completion rates for four-year schools also are reported.
Degrees and Other Awards Conferred	Reported separately are certificates/diplomas earned in less than four years, associate's and bachelor's degrees, post-bachelor's certificates, master's degrees, post-master's awards, doctoral degrees, law, medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, optometry, osteopathic medicine and veterinary medicine degrees.
Tuition and Required Fees for In-State Undergraduates	Out-of-state undergraduate charges and in- and out-of-state graduate and first-professional student tuition and fee comparisons are reported separately.

State and Local Funds for Campus Operations per FTE Student	Funds for general purpose operations, educational special purposes, health professions education, statewide system operations, state support to private colleges other than student financial aid, contract education programs and statewide student financial aid programs administered off campus are reported separately.
Tuition and Fees Revenue for Campus Operations per FTE Student	Funds dedicated to debt service are identified separately.
All Ranks Full-Time Faculty Salaries	Comparisons by faculty rank are reported separately.
Additional Benefits for Full-Time Faculty as a Percent of Salary	Comparisons for specific benefits (retirement, social security, health insurance, etc.) are reported separately.
