Decision Time: What Will *King v. Burwell* Mean for States?

For months we have watched and speculated how the Supreme Court would rule in the *King v. Burwell* case. NASHP has released a number of [materials](#) to help states as they prepare to take the next steps regardless of how the court rules.

What is at stake?

- A pro-*King* ruling means 34 states currently operating without a state-based exchange stand to lose subsidies potentially leaving millions of Americans without access to affordable health care.
- A ruling against *King* would provide some certainty to the Affordable Care Act and allow for new opportunities to advance reform.

Are states ready for the decision?

While no states have legislated a back-up plan, a number of states have considered bills for the creation of a state-based exchange. An updated [State Refor\(u\)m chart](#) outlines state legislative activity surrounding exchanges this session.

Maine has come closest to enacting a law, in the event of a decision for the plaintiff, with [LD 1344](#), "An Act to Protect Maine Consumers in the Individual Health Insurance Market and Support Maine's Economy". Currently awaiting a final vote in the Senate, the bill allows the state to establish a state-based health insurance exchange should the U.S. Supreme Court strike down the ability for the Federally Facilitated Marketplace (FFM) to continue to provide subsidies. In an [issue brief](#) earlier this year, NASHP identified considerations and policy options for states pending the outcome of *King v. Burwell*.

Are there new models states can follow if there is a pro- *King* decision?

A [new brief from NASHP](#) looks at one proposed model, New Mexico's SBM. This brief provides a detailed examination of New Mexico's proposed model including an analysis of the applicability of the model to FFM or SPM, a breakdown of exchange responsibilities, and comparison to other existing marketplace models.
