Statewide Summary – SCDOT crews in Districts 3 and 4 have worked overnight and will continue de-icing operations today as necessary with the focus on primary and secondary roads. Most of the work continues to occur in Anderson, Cherokee, Greenville, Oconee, Pickens, Spartanburg, and York counties.

With surface temperatures well below freezing, icy patches will remain until higher temperatures and sunlight can improve conditions.

Continued caution is advised for travel today and tonight until icy areas dry. SCDOT crews continue to treat affected areas.

The following employees and equipment have been active and the following materials already applied to the roadways.

311	Maintenance employees actively involved with road operations
6,180	Tons of Salt (cumulative total)
891	Tons of Sand (cumulative total)
16,870	Gallons of calcium chloride
802,968	Gallons of salt brine
164	Equipment in use

Engineering District 2 – Crews worked overnight in Anderson to treat icy areas with de-icing materials. Several crews continue to assist District 3.

Engineering District 3 – Crews continue to work in Greenville and Spartanburg counties to apply de-icing materials on icy areas on interstates, primary and secondary roads. Oconee and Pickens counties report roads are mostly dry with crews treating reported icy spots with deicing materials.

Engineering District 4 – Cherokee and York counties will continue work today to apply de-icing materials on icy areas on primary and secondary roads.
