The presenter for this webinar is Josh Wiener whose bio appears below.

Joshua M. Wiener, Ph.D., is a Distinguished Fellow and former Program Director for Aging, Disability and Long-Term Care at RTI International. With more than 40 years of experience, he is the author or editor of eight books and over 300 journal articles, reports and monographs on health care for older people, persons with dementia, people with disabilities, quality assurance for long-term services and supports, residential care facilities, financing and delivery of long-term services and supports, international health care systems, and Medicaid. Since 2004, he has been the co-director of the Administration on Aging-funded National Alzheimer's and Dementia Resource Center. Dr. Wiener is currently involved in studies of Alzheimer's disease, Medicaid home and community-based services, medical homes, and health care system reform. Prior to coming to RTI International, Dr. Wiener did policy analysis and research for the Urban Institute, the Brookings Institution, the Health Care Financing Administration (the previous name for the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services), the Massachusetts Department of Public Health, the Congressional Budget Office, the New York State Moreland Act Commission on Nursing Homes and Residential Facilities, and the New York City Department of Health. Since joining RTI, he has been involved in over 100 grant and contract proposals.
