Governor's Kevin Bryant's presentation at Furman OLLI last year last year. Nancy told me that you were instrumental in getting the Lt. Governor and a member of his staff to do the presentation at Furman.

I am the Chairperson this year for Senior Leadership Greenville. Right now, we are in the process of planning our April 13, 2018 session, "Government & Senior Advocacy" for the current class. The Senior Leaders program is sponsored by Furman University and the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI) along with community partners Bon Secours and Senior Action. I have attached a program brochure for your review. There are 30 class participants in each class plus staff and support personnel. The current 2017-2018 Leadership class started in August 2017 and will graduate in May 2018.
