A Ninth Circuit panel on Friday chastised the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency once again for a string of delays in taking action on a request to ban the pesticide chlorpyrifos, rejecting the agency's request for a six-month extension and giving it three months instead.

### Ohio's Attempt To Defund Planned Parenthood Blocked

An Ohio federal judge on Friday permanently shot down a state law blocking funding for two Planned Parenthood affiliates, ruling that the law violates the First Amendment right to freedom of speech and the Fourteenth Amendment's due process clause.

### Pastors Sue Illinois Over Gay Conversion Therapy Ban

A coalition of Illinois pastors sued the state in federal court on Thursday over a law that bars therapists and counselors from using so-called conversion therapy in attempting to change a minor's sexual orientation, alleging that the government overreached by also applying the ban to religious clergy not licensed by the state.

## State Gov't Group Urges Feds To Stay Out Of Sports Betting

The National Conference of State Legislatures on Thursday called on the federal government to recognize states' sovereignty in regulating, taxing or prohibiting internet gambling, sports gambling and daily fantasy sports contests, coming just days after a Third Circuit ruling shot down New Jersey's attempt to allow sports betting by saying it was violative of a federal law.

### Trump, Clinton Tout Infrastructure Spending, With Few Details

Calls by Hillary Clinton and Donald Trump to spur economic growth with increased infrastructure investment have stoked optimism that the candidates will prioritize fixing the nation's crumbling roads, bridges and highways. But experts say a shortage of specifics from the presidential hopefuls casts doubt on whether they'll make good on their promises.

### High Court Should Review Tip-Pool Ruling, Says Casino

Wynn Las Vegas has asked the Supreme Court to review a Ninth Circuit decision that held the U.S. Department of Labor is empowered to restrict employers from tip-pooling, saying the appeals court decision wrongly interprets court precedent and the Fair Labor Standards Act and could lead to expansive federal agency authority.

### UNC Can't Duck Transgender Bathroom Lawsuit, Feds Say

The University of North Carolina can't escape the high-stakes suit over the state's law requiring transgender people to use public bathrooms that correspond with their birth gender, the U.S. Department of Justice said on Thursday, adding that the school has sent mixed messages as to what its policy really is.

The Ninth Circuit refused on Thursday to block CTIA-The Wireless Association from arguing that the Federal Communications Commission doesn't actually require radio frequency disclosures, as the trade group challenges the city of Berkeley, California's cellphone warning ordinance.
