COLUMBIA, S.C. - The One SC Fund, a fundraising effort that helps South Carolinians who are recovering from unprecedented flooding continue the re-building process, today announced additional grants for non-profits across the state.

Governor Nikki Haley – with the help of Central Carolina Community Foundation and a team of South Carolinians from entertainment, business and public service - announced the One SC Fund in December after flooding touched South Carolinians from every walk of life.

Nonprofits are set to receive \$760,000 in Phase II grants and will provide volunteer labor and an additional \$4.2 million in financial support for these projects that range from mold to complete home rebuilding.

How Nonprofits Can Apply for Grants from the One SC Flood Relief Fund

- Phase Three grants will fund long-term rebuilding projects in the 24 FEMA designated emergency counties
- Nonprofit organizations can apply for Phase Three grants until Friday, April 1st at 6:00 PM
- Nonprofit organizations (or those with a 501(c)3 fiscal agent) that are helping individuals return to their homes may request up to \$25,000.
- Individuals may not apply
