- 1. A RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE AMENDED AND RESTATED AGREEMENT FOR DEVELOPMENT OF A JOINT COUNTY INDUSTRIAL PARK EXECUTED ON MAY 17, 2010, BY AND AMONG DORCHESTER COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA, AND ORANGEBURG COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA, PROVIDING**

FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A JOINTLY OPERATED INDUSTRIAL/BUSINESS PARK SO AS TO INCLUDE PROPERTY OF KEYSTONE INDUSTRIAL CORPORATION AND INNOVATIVE MACHINING TECHNOLOGY, INC.

Chairman Wright asked Mr. Young for a brief summary. Mr. Young yielded to Jerrod Anderson, County Attorney. Mr. Anderson stated that Keystone Industrial Corporation and Innovative Machining Technology, Inc. want to expand their operations within the Dorchester and Orangeburg Multi-County Industrial Park. The physical location is in Summerville and per the agreement, any expansion must be approved by an Ordinance in the County where the business will be located. As the expansion will be in Dorchester County, Orangeburg County only needs to pass a Resolution. The Business is promising to invest \$6.6 Million and to create 45 new full-time jobs.

Councilwoman Cooper-Smith moved to approve the Resolution, seconded by Councilman Wimberly. Motion carried.

2. ORDINANCE – SECOND READING

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A LEASE AGREEMENT AND THE EXPANSION OF EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS WITH NORTH FAMILY COMMUNITY SCHOOL

Councilman Heyward Livingston moved to carry this Ordinance to the next meeting, seconded by Councilman Owens. Motion carried.

3. ORDINANCE – PUBLIC HEARING AND THIRD READING

AN ORDINANCE TO REDUCE THE ASSESSMENT RATIO APPLICABLE IN DETERMINING THE ASSESSED VALUE OF GENERAL AVIATION AIRCRAFT TO FOUR PERCENT (4%)

No comments were made during the Public Hearing.

Councilman Owens moved to approve the Ordinance for third and final reading, seconded by Councilman Heyward Livingston. Motion carried.

4. CONTRACT REGARDING USE OF OCSO DEPUTIES AS SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS AND FOR ADDITIONAL SECURITY SERVICES
A. SCHOOL DISTRICT 3
B. SCHOOL DISTRICT 4
C. SCHOOL DISTRICT 5

Mr. Young stated that in the past there were School Resource Officer Grants that were done through the County for officers to be placed at the schools. The state legislature has

since changed that and authorized funding for each school district for school security purposes. In turn, the school now has to contract with the County of Orangeburg and The Sheriff's Office which will be providing those services must have any contracts approved by Council.

Councilman Wimberly moved to approve all three contracts, seconded by Councilman Ravenell. Motion carried.

5. INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR MAGISTRATE TO SERVE AS MUNICIPAL COURT JUDGE

Mr. Young stated that The Town of Rowesville has asked for assistance from the Magistrate's Office for municipal court judge support. The town will pay the County \$1,500.00 per quarter and the County will pay the judge \$500.00 per month. Councilman Owens asked if the County has enough Magistrates to cover this request. Judge Derrick Dash stated that we did.

Councilman Wimberly moved to approve the Agreement, seconded by Councilman Owens. Motion carried.

6. PROCUREMENT – VAN

Mr. Young stated that a bid was prepared for Procurement FY14-0728, a Passenger Van for the Detention Center. It was advertised as required and there was one responding vendor. That vendor was Al Bilton Ford of Holly Hill in the amount of \$26,982.68. It is the recommendation of the review committee that the proposal be awarded to Al Bilton Ford.

Mr. Young also stated that the County tries to award as many bids as possible to vendors that are located within Orangeburg County.

Councilwoman Cooper-Smith moved to approve the procurement recommendation, seconded by Councilman Ravenell. Motion carried.

7. VOTE FOR EXECUTIVE SESSION

Councilman Owens moved for Executive Session, seconded by Councilman Heyward Livingston. Motion carried.

Mr. Young stated that the Community of Character Pack held an event this past Saturday that provided school supplies for County Employees that were in need of those items. Funds were provided by their fellow County coworkers.

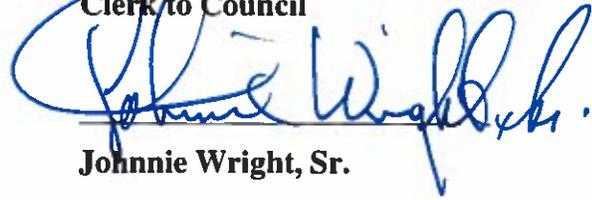
8. VOTE FOR ADJOURNMENT
