Carolina Home Grown

Irresistibly Intoxicating

I love gardenias. Their perfectly sculpted waxy-white flowers and sweet fragrance are irresistible. Native to China, Taiwan, and Japan, gardenias have been in North America for more than 250 years. Named after Dr. Alexander

Garden (1728-1791), a Scottish naturalist, physician and planter, gardenias first arrived at Garden's Yeshoe Plantation in Charleston ("Charles Towne"). In short time, their popularity spread throughout the colonies and across to Europe.

Gardenias may reach a height and spread of 4 to 6 ft., although I've seen 8 ft. high specimens. Their polished evergreen leaves provide an attractive canvas for their bountiful floral display, which is heaviest in late April to June and intermittent thereafter. Since Dr. Garden's time, gardenias have come a long way, with so many delectable choices.

Cultivars with double-white flowers include First Love®, 'August Beauty,' and 'Mystery.' 'Chuck Hayes' bears jaw-dropping semi-double flowers, and 'Grif's Select,' 'Kleim's Hardy,' 'Shooting Star,' and 'Variegata' have single-white flowers. Heaven Scent™ is a compact columnar-shaped gardenia with a height and spread of 3 to 4 ft. It produces a blizzard of single white flowers in June and reblooms through August and September. In the fall, the flowers give rise to attractive orange-red fruits that persist in winter.

I'm especially enchanted by the double-flowered gardenias. Often, when I admire an exquisitely designed flower, time stands still – and for a brief moment everything seems right with the world.

Perhaps that's why gardenias have been cultivated for over a thousand years.

Carolina Animals at Risk

Note: Our ongoing feature shares information about Carolinas endangered animals. Some are cuddly, others – not so much. All are important and the Wildlife Federations of both Carolinas are working hard to raise awareness of these important creature assets. Enjoy!

Red Wolf (*Canis rufus*)

In the 1800s, the red wolf flourished throughout the southeastern United States. By 1920, however, only a few of these medium-sized wild canines were left due to predation control and habitat loss. The species was officially declared endangered in the 1970s and 17 wild red wolves were captured for a breeding

program. By 1987, enough captive wolves had been successfully bred to begin the first restoration program in northeastern North Carolina. Now, 100 red wolves roam 1.7 million protected acres of their native habitat.

There are currently 43 sites across the U.S. still involved in the red wolf captive breeding program with a total of 200 wolves. Nevertheless, accidental killing of red wolves during nighttime coyote hunting continues to pose a grave threat to this endangered species.

Red wolves are slightly smaller with more slender heads and shorter coats than their grey wolf relatives, but are very similar in shape and appearance to the non-native coyote species of North Carolina. Currently, the North Carolina Wildlife Federation is working to make nighttime hunting of coyotes illegal in the state so as to prevent future accidental killings of red wolves.
