- Williamsburg County EMD is preparing to open a shelter, which if needed, will be managed and run by the Williamsburg County CERT.
- Damage Assessment is ongoing throughout the impact areas.

One person was trapped in their home on Boykin Road, but she has since been removed by local fire department personnel.

Currently, no injuries are being reported.

Reports of three possible, separate tornadoes in Williamsburg. Although no state assistance has been requested, EMD is deploying a representative to the county EOC. There have been no injuries or major damages reported at this time.

Numerous reports of downed trees and broken power line poles in Aiken, Greenwood, Clarendon, Williamsburg, and Jasper. Crews are working to clear debris (some from blocked roadways) and restore power.
