I'm writing Buzz. I have a couple of items the governor may be interested in weighing in on.

I'm writing about the CAFR, which was published finally yesterday, and the state GOP withdrawing from the Greenville lawsuit to close the primaries, allowing only registered party members to participate.

The CAFR came out late because the state has been moving to a new accounting system while enduring budget and staffing cuts, I was told. The document was six months behind schedule.

I would be interested in knowing:

Does Governor Haley know the CAFR was late? Did it concern her at all? Is that document important to the state, from her perspective?

What is Gov. Haley's reaction to the S.C. GOP withdrawing from the lawsuit? Does she support an effort to change the law so only registered party members can vote in party primaries?

I saw she's making a presentation at the State House in a little while.
