FYI, the National Association of Child Care Resource and Referral Agencies (NACCRRA- changing their name to Child Care Aware), puts out a ranking of states on various forms of child care and how well they perceive states are doing based on their subjective measurements. SC scored 0 points because our regulations do not allow us to inspect family child care homes prior to issuance of a registration. They obtained a great deal of information from us which they apparently did not use - once they determine states are not doing these inspections (we do it only upon receipt of complaint, per our legislative regulations) they don't consider anything else a state is doing.
