TIDBIT! Horseshoe Falls is located at Musgrove Mill State Historic Site on Cedar Shoals Creek just northeast of where the creek joins the Enoree River. The falls are considered a cascading waterfall which usually describes a waterfall with any kind of irregular surface underneath the water. Horseshoe Falls is a geographic oddity because it is found in the Piedmont section of South Carolina.

According to legend, Mary Musgrove helped a Patriot blacksmith, Gailbreth Robinson, hide from Loyalist troops near the falls. Robinson, nicknamed Horseshoe, was brought food and information about the Loyalists' activities by Mary. The falls might have been named in Robinson's honor or the name could derive from the horseshoe shape of the cascade.
