**Department of Juvenile Justice Holds Ceremony to Rename Dormitories
New Names – New Focus – On Trees**

Columbia, SC - On Friday, May 16, 2014, the South Carolina Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) Director Margaret H. Barber will lead a ceremony to unveil permanent names for five dormitories and a transition home for girls on the Department's Broad River Road Complex.

Currently, the majority of the dormitories have names that are military in nature and the transition house has never been named. The new names are more universal and environmentally friendly – names that are associated with trees.
