SECTION 1: The Minutes for the meeting of August 9, 2000; copies of which had been previously mailed to each member of the Commission, were approved.


SECTION 2: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the sale of surplus right of way property - land, as shown in detail in the Appendix.


SECTION 3: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department in removing roads from the State Highway System, as shown in detail in the Appendix.


SECTION 4: The Commission unanimously passed a motion rescinding it's action in adding sections of roads to the State Highway System, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 5: The Commission unanimously passed a motion adding sections of road to the State Highway System, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 6: On motion of Commissioner Atkins, seconded by Commissioner Harrell, the Commission unanimously passed a motion to carry forward adoption of the 2001/2002 Budget until the October 12, 2000 meeting.

SECTION 7: On motion of Commissioner Atkins, seconded by Commissioner Mack, the Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the removal of the Camperdown Way Bridge in Greenville County from the state system and turning it over to Greenville County to do as they determine and at their expense. 

SECTION 8: On motion of Commissioner Mack, seconded by Commissioner Harrell, the Commission unanimously passed a motion approving a resolution naming the interchange at I-77 and Highway 160 adjacent to the Town of Fort Mill as the "J. H. "Hoss" Nesbitt Interchange". A copy of the resolution is shown in the Appendix. 

SECTION 9: On motion of Commissioner Mack, seconded by Commissioner Harrell, the Commission unanimously passed a motion approving a resolution naming a portion of Gold Hill Road from I-77 to SC 160 the "Becky Meacham-Richardson Highway". A copy of the resolution is shown in the Appendix. 

SECTION 10: On motion of Commissioner Harrell, seconded by Commissioner Truluck, the Commission unanimously passed a motion to go into Executive Session.

Executive Session

The Commission went into Executive Session for the purpose of discussing precontractual and legal matters

Open Session

SECTION 11: On motion of Commissioner Hardee, seconded by Commissioner Truluck, the Commission passed a motion approving a contract between Balfour Beatty and the SCDOT for the SC 170 project in Beaufort County. Commissioners Atkins and Harrell cast negative votes for this motion.

SECTION 12: Commissioner Hardee made a motion to excuse the absent of Commissioner Stoddard due to illness. Commissioner Truluck seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

SECTION 13: There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting was adjourned at 5:15 p.m.

1. **File 26.856 – Conway By-pass – Horry County**

During construction of improvements on the Conway By Pass, under File 26.856 in Horry County, near the Town of North Myrtle Beach, the Department acquired by Condemnation from Colonial Realty Limited Partnership and from Burroughs and Chapin Company.

During negotiations for new right-of-way for the Conway By Pass from Susan Duke, et al, the Legal Department agreed to convey two surplus parcels of land to provide access to the Condemnee and give credit towards the monetary settlement in order to settle a difficult case requiring land acquisition and a change in access. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 1.47 acres of land to **Susan M. Duke, et al** was executed on July 7, 2000.

2. **File 26.836 - US Route 501 - Horry County**

During construction of improvements on US 501, under File 26.836 in Horry County, near the City of Myrtle Beach, the Department acquired right of way by Title to Real Estate from The May Company and E. C. Sanders, Jr. dated November 29, 1995.

During negotiations by the Legal Department and Eller Media to obtain new right of way for the above project, it was agreed to deed a small parcel of surplus right of way in exchange for credit for the new right of way. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.04 of an acre of land to **Eller Media** was executed on July 10, 2000.

3. **File 26.856 - Conway By-Pass - Horry County**

During construction of improvements on the Conway By-Pass, under File 26.856 in Horry County, near the Town of North Myrtle Beach, the Department acquired right of way by Condemnation from Colonial Realty Limited Partnership and from Dino and Jean Theodoropoulos and from Mandarine Associates by Condemnation.

During negotiations for new right of way for the Conway By-Pass from Colonial Mall, the Legal Department agreed to convey several parcels of land to provide access to the Condemnee and give credit towards the monetary settlement in order to settle a difficult case requiring land acquisition and a change of access. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim deed for approximately 3.215 acres of land to **Colonial Realty Limited Partnership** was executed on July 10, 2000.

4. **File 727.473 - US 278 Connector - Jasper County**

During construction of improvements on Road 141, under File 727.473 in Jasper County, near the Town of Ridgeland, the Department acquired right of way by Condemnation from the J. A. Coleman Estate dated June 2, 1958.

During negotiations by the Legal Department with Maurice R. Youmans to obtain right of way for the US 278 Connector it was agreed that after the completion of the project the Department would deed one half of the surplus right of way on the left side of the centerline of Old Road S-141 back to the Grantor in exchange for credit towards new right of way. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.99 of an acre of land to **Maurice R. Youmans** was executed on July 19, 2000.

5. **File 727.473 - US 278 Connector - Jasper County**

During construction of improvements on Road 141, under File 727.473 in Jasper County, near the Town of Ridgeland, the Department acquired right of way by Condemnation from the J. A. Coleman Estate dated June 2, 1958.

During negotiations by the Legal Department with James H. Morgan Jr., to obtain right of way for the US 278 Connector it was agreed that after the completion of the project the Department would deed one half of the surplus right of way on the right side of the centerline of Old Road S-141 back to the Grantor in exchange for credit towards the new right of way. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 1.27 of an acre of land to **James H. Morgan Jr.** was executed on July 19, 2000.

This matter is reported to the Commission in accordance with the requirements of Code Section 57-5-340.

1. **File 23.286A – SC Route 146 – Greenville County**

During construction of improvements on SC Route 296, under File 23.273 in Greenville County, near the City of Greenville, the Department acquired right of way for SC Route 296 by Easement from Floride M. Green on December 27, 1946 and also by Dedication on June 28, 1945.

During negotiations with the adjacent property owner to obtain new right of way for the above project, the Department agreed to deed back any adjacent surplus right of way to the subject property owner for credit towards the new right of way obtained. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.35 of an acre of land to Kenneth C. and Sarilla B. Cosgrove was executed on August 7, 2000.

2. **File 43.439 – Road S-914 – Sumter County**

During construction of improvements on Road S-914 (Minna Place), under File 43.349 in Sumter County, near the Town of Sumter, the Department acquired right of way for Road S-914, by the "C" Program dated September 19, 1974.

A request from an adjacent property owner to purchase a small parcel of right of way was received. The request was circulated to the Engineering Sections to determine if the said parcel could be declared surplus. Therefore, a Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.28 of an acre of land to Carl C. Dubose was executed on August 3, 2000 in consideration of \$1,400.00.

3. **File 2430.474 – US 25 Business – Laurens County**

During construction of improvements on Old Highway 25 Business, under File FAP 19SE in Laurens County, near the Town of Ware Shoals, the Department acquired right of way for US Route 25 by Title to Real Estate from N. R. Timmons, Jr. dated November 30, 1993.

A request from the adjacent property owner to purchase a small parcel of right of way was received. After review it was determined that the parcel was surplus to the Department's needs. Therefore, a Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.58 of an acre of land to Nancy Childers was executed on August 7, 2000 in consideration of \$1,000.00.

4. File 23.277A – Southern Connector (I-185) – Greenville County

During construction of improvements on the Southern Connector (I-85), under File 23.277A in Greenville County, near the Town of Greenville, the Department acquired right of way for I-185, by Title to Real Estate from William T. Fowler dated October 15, 1999.

During negotiations for new right of way on the Southern Connector in Greenville, it was agreed by the attorneys representing the Department and the other parties that the subject landlocked property which was purchased by the Department would be deeded to the adjacent property owner for monetary credit towards right of way needed from him. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.7 of an acre of land to Jeff R. Richardson, Jr. was executed on August 7, 2000.

5. File 42.516 – US Route 29 & 176 Connector - Spartanburg County

During construction of improvements on US Route 29 & 176 Connector, under File 420516 in Spartanburg County, near the City of Spartanburg, the Department acquired right of way for US Route 29 & 176 Connector, by Easement from the City of Spartanburg dated April 17, 1961, by Condemnation from Henry M. Foster Estate dated May 24 1960, by Easement from Mrs. Eugenia Wheeler dated April 14, 1960 and by Condemnation from Mrs. Bennie Johnson and Dympsie Davis dated May 24, 1960.

A request from an adjacent property owner to purchase a parcel of right of way was received. Therefore, a Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.38 of an acre of land to Arthur Cleveland was executed on July 19, 2000 in consideration of \$15,000.00.

6. File 23.299A – Southern Connector – Greenville County

During construction of improvements on the Southern Connector, under File 23.299A in Greenville County, near the Town of Greenville, the Department acquired right of way for the Southern Connector by Condemnation from Gale J. Gary dated January 28, 2000.

During the negotiations for New Right of Way between Bobby Joe Ayers, Michael T. Ayers, a settlement was reached whereby the grantees would be deeded the two triangular remainders of tract 81. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for Parcel 1(0.888 of an acre) and Parcel 2(1.794 acres) to Bobby Joe and Michael T. Ayers was executed on August 11, 2000.

7. File 23.246A – I-85 – Greenville County

During construction of improvements on I-85, under File 23.416 in Greenville County, near the Town of Greenville, the Department acquired right of way for I-85, By Easement from Zeadora B. Reeves dated May 19, 1958.

During negotiations by our legal department to settle a difficult condemnation case, it was agreed to convey a parcel of surplus right of way to the adjacent owner for monetary credit towards payment for land. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.604 of an acre of land to Zeadora B. Reeves was executed on August 18, 2000.

8. File 45 B Part 2 & 3 – US Route 76 & US Route 176 – Richland County

During construction of improvement on US 176 and SC 60 Connector, under File 45B Parts 2 & 3 in Richland County, near the City of Columbia, the Department acquired right of way for US 176, by Beltline Act #101 dated 1925, by Easement from Harbison College dated December 21, 1935, and by Easement from Reverend S.S. Youngblood dated September 8, 1937.

At the request of the adjacent owner attempting to clean up title issues with his property, a request was circulated to the engineering sections to determine if any portion of the old right of way should be retained. It was determined that the parcel was surplus to Department needs. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.78 of an acre of land to McWil Partners LLC and George Randolph Walker Jr. was executed on August 16, 2000.

9. File 46.421 – S-642 – York County

During construction of improvements on S-642, under File 46.421 in York County, near the town of Fort Mill, the Department acquired right of way for Road S-642, by Easement to Right of Way from various owners dated December 8, 1956.

On August 8, 1994 the SC Highway Commission removed 0.34 of a mile of Road S-642 from the SCDOT system. The adjacent landowner is in the process of clearing the title on his land which the old roadbed clouds the title. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 2.36 of an acre of land to Regent Park Corporation was executed on August 22, 2000.

10. File 27.300 – I-95 - Jasper County

During construction of improvements on Interstate I-95, under File 27.300 in Jasper County, near the Town of Ridgeland, the Department acquired right of way for I-95 by Easement from Marie Weathersbee dated November 12, 1963.

A request was received from the County of Jasper for the Department to relinquish to the County a 50'x150' Infall Drainage area. The request was circulated to the Engineering sections to determine if said parcel could be declared surplus. Therefore, a Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.17 of an acre of land to the County of Jasper was executed on August 22, 2000 in consideration of \$1,000.00.

11. File 23.277A – I-385 – Greenville County

During construction of improvements on I-85/S-55, under File 23.277A in Greenville County, near the Town of Simpsonville, the Department acquired right of way for I-85/S-55 by Title to Real Estate from Greenville Area Commissioners for Technical Education.

A request was received from the Commissioners of Public Works of the City of Greenville requesting an easement to install a water line off the SCDOT right of way of I-385. It was decided that the easement should be granted provided a clause is added whereby the Department would not incur any cost should the water line need to be relocated in the future. Therefore, a 25-foot Gratis Easement to the Commissioners of Public Works of the City of Greenville was executed on August 22, 2000.

12. File 42.443A – US 29/SC 296 - Spartanburg County

During construction of improvements on US 29/ SC 296, under File 42.443A in Spartanburg County, near the City of Spartanburg, the Department acquired right of way by Title to Real Estate from E.E. Lawson and J.C. Steadman (Tracts 39 & 40) dated March 28, 2000 and by Title to Real Estate from Martha K. McClelland (Tract 41) dated February 9, 2000.

During negotiations with Wakefield Buick-Pontiac-GMC, Inc. to acquire new right of way for this project it was agreed that the Department would quitclaim the certain remainders of parcels to Wakefield for a consideration. Therefore, a Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.17 of an acre of land to Wakefield Buick-Pontiac-GMC, Inc. was executed on August 8, 2000 in consideration of \$14,174.25

13. File 26.836 – US 501 – Horry County

During Construction of improvements on US 501, under File 26.836 in Horry County, near the City of Conway, the Department acquired right of way for US 501, by Title to Real Estate from Jurgen and Linda Zimmer dated March 14, 1996.

During negotiations to secure new right of way for the project named above, the Grand Strand Water & Sewer Authority agreed to move their existing pump station from the new right of way. The Department agreed to deed the Authority a small parcel of surplus land that would provide a new location for the existing pump station. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.05 of an acre of land to Grand Strand Water & Sewer Authority was executed on August 31, 2000.

14. File 23.299A – Southern Connector – Greenville County

During construction of improvements on Southern Connector, under File 23.299A in Greenville County, near the City of Greenville, the Department acquired right of way for Southern Connector, by Title of Real Estate from T. Walker Brashier dated February 15, 2000.

During negotiations for new right of way in a complicated acquisition case a settlement was reached whereby an adjacent surplus parcel would be deeded to the grantee. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim deed for approximately 0.489 of an acre of land to Elizabeth Moon Tripp was executed on August 31, 2000.

15. File 23.277A – SC 14 – Greenville County

During construction of improvements on SC 14 (Pelham Road), under File 23.277A in Greenville County, near the Town of Greer, the Department acquired right of way for SC 14 (Pelham Road), by Condemnation from D. J. Enterprises Inc. of Spartanburg dated December 7, 1998 and by Title to Real Estate from Clayton M. Slatton dated September 30, 1998.

During negotiations by the Legal Department to settle a difficult condemnation case the Department agreed to deed a small parcel of uneconomic remainder and abandoned right of way on both sides of Old Hammett Bridge Road for credit for new right of way needed for this project. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.11 of an acre of land to D. J. Enterprises Inc. of Spartanburg was executed on August 31, 2000.

16. File 46.966 – S-98 Relocation - York County

During construction of improvements on S-98 Relocation in York County, near the Town of Tega Cay, the Department acquired right of way for S-98 Relocation, by Right of Way Easement from T. C. 126 Inc. dated September 12, 1986, Sadie O. McCall by Right of Way Easement dated March 29, 1988 and from John A. & Elaine M. Armstrong by Right of Way Easement dated October 9, 1986.

During negotiations by the Legal and Right of Way Departments in an effort to acquire Right of Way for S-98 Relocation, it was agreed that the Department would deed the remainders of the old roadbed of S-98 to the adjacent property owner in consideration of new right of way needed. Therefore, two Gratis Quitclaim Deeds for a total of approximately 0.62 of an acre of land to NNP-Tega Cay, LLC was executed on September 11, 2000.

This matter is reported to the Commission in accordance with the requirements of Code Section 57-5-340.

AND WHEREAS, he served as a member of the South Carolina House of Representatives from 1987 to 1990;

AND WHEREAS, he presently serves on the board of the York County Regional Chamber of Commerce, and the board of York County Natural Gas Authority;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the South Carolina Department of Transportation Commission, in meeting duly assembled this 28th day of September, 2000, that the interchange at I-77 and Highway 160 adjacent to the Town of Fort Mill be named the "J.H. "Hoss" Nesbitt Interchange" for his many contributions to the Town of Fort Mill, York County and the State of South Carolina.
