## Comments

The Department is proposing improvements to the intersection of SC 522 (Rocky River Road) and S-123 (Taxahaw Road) in Lancaster County. The proposed project will include the construction of a single lane roundabout at the intersection of SC 522 and S-123. The archaeological area of potential effect (APE) for the survey consisted of land within the existing right-of-way (ROW) and new ROW that may be impacted by the proposed undertaking. The architectural APE consisted of a 200 foot buffer placed around the archaeological APE. An archaeological survey of the project area was conducted on August 13, 2018. Field methods consisted of a pedestrian reconnaissance of the entire project area. The areas of construction have been previously disturbed by roadway, ditch and utility construction. Other areas were already paved or covered in gravel from previously removed parking lot/construction. A total of four structures were identified and recorded within the APE (Site Nos 1181-1184). These resources date to the mid-twentieth century and include one store and three residential structures. All of the resources are recommended not eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. No additional cultural resources investigations are recommended.

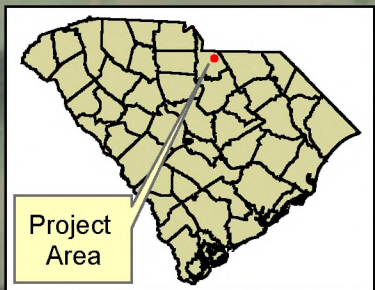
Effect Determination:
