Description/Significant Features:

The Quonset hut has a concrete slab foundation, with a corrugated steel barrel arch forming the roof and side walls. The structure measures approximately 1,920 square feet. According to SCARNG's Real Property records, the Quonset Hut was installed at the Readiness Center in 1987. However, according to Plaag (2011:147) the building was added in 1973 as the NCO Club. It is unclear if the Hut was originally constructed at the Mount Pleasant facility or if it was relocated from its original construction location.
