
Once Dr. Kirkland completed his early education in Kershaw County at Mather Academy, he matriculated to Morehouse College with another remarkable freshman by the name of Martin Luther King, Jr. Both Drs. Kirkland and King graduated from Morehouse College in 1948. It is of note that his undergraduate education was interrupted after his freshman year for service in the United States Navy. After one year, he returned to complete his undergraduate degree.

Following graduation from Morehouse College, Dr. Kirkland continued his education at Howard University where he received his Master of Science degree. His original intent was to attend medical school in South Carolina, however to help maintain its segregated policies, the state of South Carolina provided funding for minority students to go to school out of state. This resulted in Dr. Kirkland attending medical school at the historically black, Meharry Medical College in Nashville, Tennessee. In 1954, Dr. Kirkland received his Doctorate in Medicine from that prestigious institution. After medical school, Dr. Kirkland entered residency at Jersey City Medical Center and completed an additional residency and preceptorship in surgery at Tuskegee Veterans Administration Hospital in Tuskegee, Alabama. Upon completion of his preceptorship, Dr. Kirkland served as the Assistant Chief of Surgery at Tuskegee Veterans Administration Hospital from 1959 to 1961.

In 1955, Dr. Kirkland married Mary Lula Pratt of Newberry, South Carolina. The couple wished to return to South Carolina, but the options were limited in Newberry and Kershaw counties. Instead, he and his wife settled in Greenville, South Carolina. Dr. Kirkland began work at Greenville General Hospital, where he became the first African-American surgeon, an exceptional honor and distinction. In order to develop a referral base in Greenville County, Dr. Kirkland transitioned his practice to general and family medicine where he remained as a committed servant of the community until his retirement in 2005.

Dr. Kirkland's qualifications have been expounded upon throughout his life and career, leading to numerous awards and recognitions. However, the above listings represent just a brief overview of the greatness that Dr. Kirkland has been able to accomplish for the State of South Carolina. Therefore, it is with great honor that I highly recommend Dr. Levi S. Kirkland, Sr. for the Order of the Palmetto Award.

Levi S. Kirkland, Sr., M.D., was born in Camden, South Carolina on September 13, 1926. His early education was in Kershaw County at Mather Academy. Once he completed his studies here in South Carolina, he matriculated to Morehouse College with another remarkable freshman by the name of Martin Luther King, Jr. Both Drs. Kirkland and King graduated from Morehouse College in 1948. It is of note that his undergraduate education was interrupted after his freshman year for service in the United States Navy. After one year, he returned to complete his undergraduate degree.

Following graduation from Morehouse College, Dr. Kirkland continued his education at Howard University where he received his master of science degree. It is interesting to pause here and acknowledge that Dr. Kirkland's original intent was to attend medical school in South Carolina. To help maintain its segregated policies, the state of South Carolina provided funding for minority students to go to school out of state. This resulted in Dr. Kirkland attending medical school at the historically black, Meharry Medical College in Nashville, Tennessee. In 1954, Dr. Kirkland received his doctorate in medicine from that prestigious institution. After medical school, Dr. Kirkland entered residency at Jersey City Medical Center and completed an additional residency and preceptorship in surgery at Tuskegee Veterans Administration Hospital in Tuskegee, Alabama. Upon completion of his preceptorship, Dr. Kirkland served as the assistant chief of surgery at Tuskegee Veterans Administration Hospital from 1959 to 1961.

In 1955, Dr. Kirkland married Mary Lula Pratt of Newberry, South Carolina. The couple wished to return to South Carolina, but the options were quite limited in Kershaw and Newberry counties. Instead, he and his wife settled in Greenville, South Carolina - specifically, Greenville General Hospital, where he became the first African-American surgeon, a dubious distinction marred by the attitudes of the time. Unfortunately, despite his training, service, and accomplishments, he was unable to develop a referral base in the Greenville County community in the mid-1960's. Dr. Kirkland transitioned his practice to general and family medicine where he remained as a committed servant of the community until his retirement in 2005.

Dr. and Mrs. Kirkland, Sr. have two accomplished children, Levi S. Kirkland, Jr., M.D., and Gail A. Kirkland-Briscoe, D.D.S., and five grandchildren. He is a life member of the NAACP as well as the Omega Psi Phi and Sigma Pi Phi (Boule) fraternities.




