The Budget Commission met in the Governor's Office on April 2, 1943, at 10:00 o'clock, all members being present.

The following transfers were approved by the Commission on 1942-43 Appropriations:

<u>South Carolina Tax Commission</u>	
From Income Tax Revenue, \$1500.00 - To Income Tax Division, Clerks.	

<u>State Board of Medical Examiners</u>	
From Per Diem of Members, \$ 25.00 - To Office Supplies	
From Per Diem of Members, 125.00 - To Office Equipment.	

Hon. Arthur B. Rivers, Director of the South Carolina Department of Public Welfare, appeared before the Commission and stated that the Federal Government would shortly discontinue the distribution of commodities in this State. He stated that his Board was willing to carry on the work with funds already appropriated for other categories, if the Budget Commission would approve of this and would pledge its support in obtaining a deficiency appropriation to reimburse the other categories. The Commission approved this plan, and informed Mr. Rivers that the members of the Commission would, individually, support his request for a deficiency appropriation for this purpose.
