The February 12th webinar will focus on **Concepts and Examples of Dementia Capability**. During this webinar, participants will learn about concepts of dementia capability and will hear about two programs in California and North Dakota that are working to integrate dementia capability concepts into practice.

The presenters for this webinar are Jane Tilly, DrPH, Dr. David Reuben, M.D., and Gretchen Dobervich, BSW, LSW. Jane Tilly is the Team Leader for Brain Health and Dementia activities at the Administration for Community Living. She will speak about dementia capability concepts. Dr. David Reuben is Director, Multicampus Program in Geriatrics Medicine and Gerontology and Chief, Division of Geriatrics at the University of California, Los Angeles Center for Health Sciences. He will be presenting on the Alzheimer's and Dementia Care Program, which aims to provide coordinated, patient-centered care between primary care practices and community based organizations through the use of a nurse practitioner Dementia Care Manager. Gretchen Dobervich is the Vice President-North Dakota for the Minnesota-North Dakota chapter of the Alzheimer's Association. Ms. Dobervich will present on the Dementia Care Services Program in North Dakota, which provides individualized assistance to caregivers of persons with dementia in rural, hard-to-reach areas.

 - a. After registering, you will receive a confirmation email that includes the link you will need to enter the webinar on February 12th.
 - b. The webinar will be broadcast via Adobe Acrobat Connect Pro. Adobe Connect requires the flash player and a high speed internet connection is recommended. Please visit the website [here](#) to test your system to ensure you are able to log on successfully to the event. Please check your computer prior to the webinar.
2. On the day of the webinar:
 - a. Enter the webinar using Internet Explorer or Firefox. These 2 programs are optimal for the webinar system we are using—Adobe Connect.
 - b. Log in 5 minutes prior to the event to ensure we can start on time. You will need to enter the email address used during the registration process to enter the webinar.

3. Plan to use the webinar to view the presentation and ask questions through the chat feature.
