## Governor's Proclamation

**WHEREAS,** it is estimated that more than 2,200 new cases of male breast cancer will be diagnosed this year, and approximately 400 men will die from the disease; and

**WHEREAS,** men with breast cancer are, on average, 68 years of age when diagnosed, with risk factors including a family history of breast cancer, exposure to radiation, and having high levels of estrogen, which is associated with conditions including cirrhosis of the liver and obesity; and

**WHEREAS,** the misconception that breast cancer only affects women may delay diagnosis of the disease in men until it has reached a later stage where it is less likely to be cured; and

**WHEREAS,** increasing public awareness and understanding of male breast cancer can contribute to earlier detection and treatment that are critical for achieving more successful patient outcomes.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** I, Nikki R. Haley, Governor of the Great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim October 20 - 26, 2013, as

throughout the state and encourage all South Carolinians to work together to learn more about male breast cancer and to offer support to those who are currently fighting this disease.
