Continuing Education

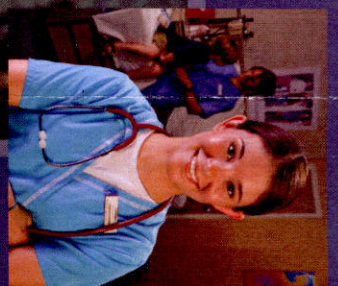
The Division of Continuing Education and Economic Development promotes economic development through a variety of training opportunities, including more than 50 certification tracks.

Courses and programs are held days, evenings, and weekends on all three TTC campuses, at various sites throughout the area, and online via the Internet.

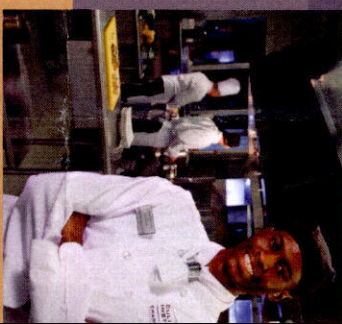

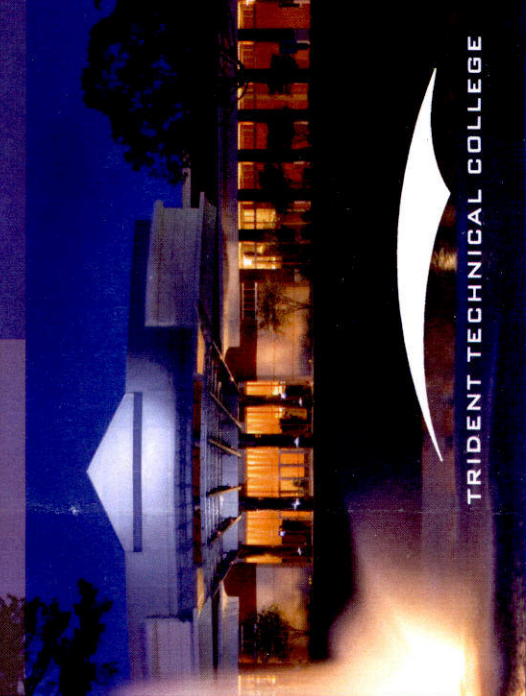

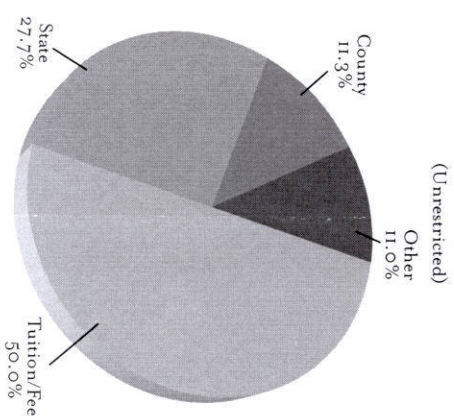
