GREENVILLE, S.C. — A committee of state lawmakers investigating the massive security breach at the Department of Revenue asked to see the department's agreement with its security provider Trustwave.

It's a 13-page addendum to the service agreement with Trustwave and entire pages of it showed up redacted.

The agreement was last updated in 2009.

State Senator Vincent Sheheen of Camden, who ran for governor against Nikki Haley let WYFF News 4 see it. Sheheen said he is upset about it.

He said he is also upset that the Department of Revenue refused to heighten the level of security until after the breach was detected.

Sheheen said he also doesn't like that the state is putting the burden on taxpayers to sign up for the free theft protection.

"The system set up is certainly not going to protect the information of the people of the state of South Carolina. South Carolina owes it to these people to provide as much security as possible. They ought to be signed up and enlisted in whatever programs to protect automatically," Sheheen said.

Sheheen said the DOR declined to provide a copy of its security policy to lawmakers citing that to do so might jeopardize the security of what's already been stolen.

WYFF News 4 asked Sheheen if he plans to run for governor again and he said he is keeping his options open.
