BY LAW, TO PROVIDE FOR A FEE IN LIEU OF TAXES INCENTIVE AND A PROJECT INFRASTRUCTURE GRANT; TO PROVIDE FOR THE INCLUSION OF THE PROJECT IN A MULTI-COUNTY BUSINESS OR INDUSTRIAL PARK; TO AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF A LEASE AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN MARLBORO COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA, AND ECAPS CORPORATION FOR CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY AND IMPROVEMENTS THEREON; TO RATIFY, AUTHORIZE AND AFFIRM ALL PRIOR ACTS AND ACTIONS OF MARLBORO COUNTY AND ITS OFFICERS AND ELECTED OFFICIALS WITH REGARD TO THE FOREGOING, INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, PRIOR LEGISLATIVE ENACTMENTS OF MARLBORO COUNTY COUNCIL AND THEIR CONTENT; AND TO ENTER INTO ANY OTHER NECESSARY AGREEMENTS WITH THE SPONSOR TO EFFECT THE INTENT OF THIS ORDINANCE; AND OTHER RELATED MATTERS. – THIRD READING

Motion made by Dr. Carolyn Prince, seconded by Mr. Willie Gladden, to approve the third reading of Ordinance # 687 - authorizing the execution and delivery of one or more incentive agreements by and between Marlboro County, South Carolina and ECAPS Corporation, and one or more affiliated or related entities, as sponsor, to the extent allowed by law, to provide for a fee in lieu of taxes incentive and a project infrastructure grant; to provide for the inclusion of the project in a multi-county business or industrial park; to authorize the execution and delivery of a lease agreement by and between Marlboro County, South Carolina, and ECAPS Corporation for certain real property and improvements thereon; to ratify, authorize and affirm all prior acts and actions of Marlboro County and its officers and elected officials with regard to the foregoing, including, without limitation, prior legislative enactments of Marlboro County Council and their content; and to enter into any other necessary agreements with the sponsor to effect the intent of this ordinance; and other related matters. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

ORDINANCE # 688 – AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AN ALTERNATIVE ALLOCATION METHOD FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF FEE-IN-LIEU OF AD VALOREM TAX PAYMENTS AMONG THE TAXING ENTITIES WITHIN MARLBORO COUNTY WHICH ARE PAID BY ONE OR MORE COMPANIES LOCATED WITHIN A MULTI-COUNTY INDUSTRIAL PARK; AND OTHER MATTERS RELATED THERETO. – THIRD READING.

Motion made by Mr. Anthony Woods, seconded by Ms. Corrie Plato, to approve the third reading of Ordinance # 688 - An Ordinance approving an Alternative allocation method for the Distribution of fee-in-lieu of AD VALOREM Tax Payments among the

taxing entities within Marlboro County which are paid by one or more companies located within a Multi-County Industrial Park; and other matters related thereto. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

ORDINANCE # 689 – AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING MARLBORO COUNTY TO CONTINUE AN AGREEMENT WITH THE MARLBORO COUNTY RESCUE SQUAD

PROVIDING PARAMEDIC LEVEL EMERGENCY SERVICE AND TRANSFER SERVICE THROUGHOUT MARLBORO COUNTY. – THIRD READING.

Motion made by Mr. Steve Blackmon, seconded by Dr. Carolyn Prince, to approve the third reading of Ordinance # 689 – An Ordinance authorizing Marlboro County to continue an agreement with the Marlboro County Rescue Squad providing paramedic level emergency service and transfer service throughout Marlboro County. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

ORDINANCE # 690 – AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE REQUEST OF WALLACE WATER COMPANY FOR AN ENCROACHMENT FOR THE INSTALLATION OF WATER LINES. – THIRD READING.

Motion made by Mr. Jason Steen, seconded by Mr. Steve Blackmon, to approve the third reading of Ordinance # 690 – An Ordinance approving the request of Wallace Water Company for an encroachment for the installation of water lines. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

ORDINANCE # 691 – AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR DETERMINING WHAT CONSTITUTES A COUNTY PUBLIC ROAD AND SERVES A PUBLIC PURPOSE ALLOWING FOR COUNTY MAINTENANCE – THIRD READING.

Allows the county to provide courtesy drags on roads if there is a public safety issue.

Motion made by Mr. Willie Gladden, seconded by Mr. Anthony Woods, to approve the third reading of Ordinance # 691 – An Ordinance providing for determining what constitutes a county public road and serves a public purpose allowing for county maintenance. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

ORDINANCE # 692 – AN ORDINANCE TO APPROVE THE LEASE AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE COUNTY AND 5-STAR USA CORPORATION. – SECOND READING.

Motion made by Dr. Carolyn Prince, seconded by Mr. Anthony Woods, to approve the second reading of Ordinance # 692 – An Ordinance to approve the lease agreement by and between the County and 5-Star USA Corporation. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

ORDINANCE # 618B – AMENDING ORDINANCE # 618A ENTITLED “ AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF NOT EXCEEDING FOUR MILLION DOLLARS (\$4,000,000) GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF MARLBORO COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA, TO PRESCRIBE THE PURPOSES FOR WHICH THE PROCEEDS SHALL BE EXPENDED, TO PROVIDE FOR THE PAYMENT THEREOF, AND OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO” IN ORDER

TO PROVIDE THAT RENOVATIONS OF THE CURRENT ADMINISTRATION BUILDING; OFFICES CURRENTLY PROVIDING ADMINISTRATIVE FUNCTIONS TO MARLBORO COUNTY; RENOVATIONS OF THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT BUILDING; AND TO PROVIDE FUNDS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW ANIMAL SHELTER SHALL BE AN ADDITIONAL USE OF PROCEEDS OF THE BONDS AUTHORIZED THEREIN, AND OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO. – FIRST READING.

It allows for the bond funds which were originally set to build a new administration building, renovate the courthouse, renovate the D.D. McColl House, and build the Sheriff/Magistrate Building to be changed to renovating the current administration building, provide funds for offices for currently providing administrative services, renovate the Economic Development Building, and provide funding for the Humane Society Animal Shelter.

Mr. Kimrey advised that after the courthouse renovations are completed there may be approximately 1.2 to 1.3 million dollars left. Mr. Ron Munnerlyn, Council Chair advised the administration building needed to stay near the courthouse. He advised he had spoken with the Kinney foundation and they suggested they may possibly donate the two building right beside the administration building to the county to tear down and provide additional parking. He stated there are three readings to the ordinance which would give council time to discuss the various options.

Motion made by Mr. Anthony Woods, seconded by Dr. Carolyn Prince, to approve the first reading of Ordinance # 618B - Amending Ordinance # 618 A entitled “ An Ordinance to provide for the issuance and sale of not exceeding four million dollars (\$4,000,000) General Obligation Bonds of Marlboro County, South Carolina, to prescribe the purposes for which the proceeds shall be expended, to provide for the payment thereof, and other matters relating thereto” in order to provide that renovations of the Current Administrative Building; Offices currently providing administrative functions to Marlboro County; renovations of the Economic Development Building; and to provide funds for the construction of a new animal shelter shall be an additional use of proceeds of the Bonds authorized therein, and other matters relating thereto. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION # 07-11-01 – RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR HUMANE SOCIETY EFFORT TO CONSTRUCT ANIMAL SHELTER.

Mr. Ron Munnerlyn, Chairman read the Resolution aloud. The resolution provides for:

- Upon \$50,000 match from Humane Society and \$50,000 match from City of Bennettsville, the County of Marlboro will provide \$50,000 to be used for construction of a new animal shelter.
- Marlboro County will contribute \$7,500 annually for a period of five years to be used for operational expenses related to the Shelter operations.

- The Shelter must agree to receive animals from the Marlboro County Animal Control department at no cost, other than those pledged in resolution.
- Marlboro County will consider a donation or a low cost lease of land adjacent to the Detention Center contingent on the Humane Society providing to the county a site and building plan undertaken by a professional engineering, architectural or construction firm with expertise in design of such facilities.
- Prior to the grant of cash or land, the Humane Society must provide to the County Council's satisfaction a three year funding and operational/staffing plan for the shelter.
- The Humane Society shall continue to maintain its status as 501 © (3) nonprofit organization.
- The final site selection and building design shall be subject to County review and approval.
- The Humane Society shall be subject to all County ordinances and existing state statutes.
- The money paid by the county will be paid at its sole discretion and pursuant to the terms of a written memorandum of operations between the County and the Humane Society.
- If any conflict arises between the provisions of the resolution and any state law, the provisions of state law shall prevail and be controlling.

Motion made by Mr. Steve Blackmon, seconded by Dr. Carolyn Prince, to approve Resolution # 07-11-01 – A Resolution of support for Humane Society effort to construct animal shelter. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

CONSIDERATION OF STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS TO FORMALLY REQUEST OWNERSHIP OF THE EXISTING BLENHEIM SCHOOL GYMNASIUM FROM THE MARLBORO COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT.

Mr. Anthony Woods advised the school district is still in limbo as to their plans for the Blenheim school gymnasium. The school district has advised it will 2012 (June/July) before they plan to move forward. Mr. Woods advised the gymnasium is attached to a whole wing of rooms. There are issues with no air conditioning and possible mold. Dr. Carolyn Prince questioned the status of the surrounding field. Mr. Woods advised he had no information concerning the field. Mr. Cecil Kimrey, County Administrator advised EOC wants the additional wing attached with the gymnasium.

It was discussed the county could officially request the building and go through the various stages to accept the property. Dr. Carolyn Prince advised she thought it was a good idea and she wished to formally request it and to do an environmental study on the building. Mr. Willie Gladden stated the issue with the air conditioning would cost probably closer to \$80,000 than \$50,000.

Motion made by Mr. Anthony Woods, seconded by Dr. Carolyn Prince, to approve the staff recommendations to formally request ownership of the existing Blenheim School

Gymnasium from the Marlboro County School District and to complete an environmental study. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

REQUEST PERMISSION TO ACCEPT AND RELOCATE A DOUBLEWIDE MOBILE HOME DONATED BY MARION COUNT TRINITY BEHAVIORAL CARE TO LINDSAY PARK FOR THE PURPOSE OF A OFFICE FOR THE RECREATION DEPARTMENT ALONG WITH APPROVAL OF ASSOCIATED COSTS.

The estimated cost to construct 500 feet of 6 foot fencing, move the doublewide, install water and sewer, and HVAC purchase and installation was \$20,000. Mr. Cecil Kimrey, County Administrator advised he had received a call from Trinity Behavioral Care advising they were closing down some of their offices and offered to donate one of their doublewides to Marlboro County. He advised the mobile home could be placed at Lindsay Park and used for office space for Recreation Staff. A metal building to house equipment could be constructed for approximately \$35,000. Mr. Willie Gladden stated he could see no need for it. He did not see any need in spending the money to move recreation out to Lindsay Park when there were other projects going on and being put on hold. Dr. Carolyn Prince stated it was her perception that it would not be a good use of the county's resources. She said she was thinking of liability and safety. She did not think it was a good idea to spend \$60,000 at the present, she thought the Blenheim School would be an ideal place. She thought the county could make the Blenheim gym work and accommodate an excellent recreational program. She requested the item be tabled. Mr. Jason Steen stated he thought council should come up with a complete plan before moving forward with anything. Mr. Cecil Kimrey advised if Marlboro County did not accept the doublewide, it would be given to someone else. The issue died due to lack of motion.

DISCUSSION OF I-95 GATEWAY INDUSTRIAL PARK.

Mr. Cecil Kimrey, County Administrator advised he had received a request from Dillon County to move forward with the construction of a Spec Building. He was requested to make a recommendation to council for the county to commit to \$50,000 per year for a term of ten (10) years totaling \$50,000.00. Mr. Kimrey advised he would not make a recommendation because of the cost involved. He said an alternative would be to commit to a lesser amount up to \$200,000 or \$20,000/\$25,000 up to ten years. The \$50,000 the county has been paying in operations could go against the building. Any money that is borrowed could go against the county's bond and could limit the amount of funds the county could borrow. The county would be obligated to a third of any funds which are borrowed. Mr. Kimrey advised that whatever the three counties commit to, then they can go to Commerce and ask them to match it. The building in question is only a shell building.

Council would not agree to commit to long term financing.

DONATION OF A POLICE CAR TO TOWN OF CLIO.

Mr. Anthony Woods advised the Town of Clio is in need of police cars. They have requested the donation of any feasible cars which are not being used by the Sheriff Department.

Mr. Cecil Kimrey, County Administrator advised he had checked and there was a car which could be used.

Motion made by Dr. Carolyn Prince, seconded by Mr. Willie Gladden, to approve the donation of a police car to the town of Clio. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

APPOINTMENTS TO BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

No appointments were made.

OPENING & ACCEPTANCE OF BIDS

Recording System for Family Courtroom renovation project – bids received were: Adtek, Inc., Corporate Office (Install Small Sound System) \$7,488.20 and (Replace Mics and Jacks) \$2,463.67.

Motion made by Mr. Ken Allen, seconded by Mr. Jason Steen, to approve the bid as presented by Adtek, Inc., Corporate Office in the total amount of \$9,951.87. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

Construction of Truck Lane for Carolina AAC project – bids received were: **L & L** - \$138,416.83, **Kirven** - \$145,636.25, and **Four S** - \$161,990.00. The lowest bidder was L & L.

Mr. Cecil Kimrey, County Administrator requested council approve the lowest bid contingent upon construction scheduling.

Motion made by Mr. Willie Gladden, seconded by Mr. Jason Steen, to award the Construction of Truck Lane bid for Carolina AAC project to L & L in the amount of \$161,990.00 contingent upon construction scheduling allowing it to be awarded. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

REPORTS

COMMITTEE REPORTS

No committee reports were given.

ADMINISTRATIVE/FINANCIAL REPORT – CECIL KIMREY, COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR

Expenditure & Revenue report was provided to Council for the month ending June 2011. Expenditures were are 94%. Revenues were at 91% and continuing to decline.

Employee Recognition – Employees with at least five years service through the end of June include: James Smith (15 years), Robert Stanton (13 years), and Richard Woodham (7 years).

LEMPEG – Marlboro County has been awarded additional funds from the State of SC Military Department Emergency Management Division. An additional funding of \$35,650 has been added to the Local Emergency Management Performance Grant of \$16,431 for a total of \$52,981 for FY 2011..

Hood Road – will be added to the County Index after the third reading of Ordinance # 691.

Estimated Costs – (a) Remove administration building. The old cost was \$179,000. Staff is waiting on the architect to provide an updated cost. (b) Cost to construct a 30' X 50' metal building for recreation is \$50,000.

Blenheim School Gym – Jimmy Tuel, Marlboro County School District had been on vacation. The Administrator has left a message for him to contact him in order to obtain the utility costs for the Blenheim gym building.

Dillon County Request – have sent a request concerning Harbor Freight. Staff is waiting on additional information from the County Administrator of Dillon.

Pee Dee Workforce Investment Board – staff received the One-Stop System Operator Agreement from Pee Dee COG with the request the council chairman sign the agreement as soon as possible and return.

Cooperative Service Agreement – the agreement between Darlington County, Marlboro County, and USDA Wildlife Services was received. The Administrator advised it would be placed on the August Agenda for council approval.

Airport – the county received a grant offer for the airport in the amount of: FAA - \$39,076, State Match - \$1,028 and County Match - \$1,028. The Administrator advised he would get it executed and returned to FAA.

Dr. Carolyn Prince questioned whether Saddlebrook was a county road. Mr. Kimrey advised he would check the status and let her know.

RECOGNITION OF CITIZEN'S REQUEST BEFORE COUNCIL

Mr. Fred Nickoles – addressed council concerning Ordinance # 687. He wanted Council to explain more about ECAPS and 5Star. He questioned who they were. He also stated he was suggesting someone to come in concerning I-95 and explain more about it. He stated his last issue was the renovations of the Administration Building, he stated he liked having the meetings at the library where there was more room

RECOGNITION OF COUNCIL MEMBERS

Mr. Ken Allen – no comments.

Mr. Steve Blackmon – no comments.

Dr. Carolyn Prince - referred to the last weekly Administrator's report. She questioned who decided the first sign to be bid out would be 15/401. Mr. Kimrey advised it was the only one with a right-of-way.

Mr. Willie Gladden – stated he was concerned about losing Senator Elliott. He wanted council to send a letter to the Democratic party giving them support in their efforts of fighting for Senator Elliott. He thought the citizens needed to know what is going on with the House. Ms. Munnerlyn would only have part of Marlboro County, a portion of Darlington County, and a portion of Chesterfield County. He said this was an extremely important matter.

Mr. Gladden wanted to know the status of Brightsville. He questioned if there was water or lights? He wanted to hold a grand-opening as soon as possible. He questioned the landscaping. Mr. Kimrey advised the county had never done any landscaping for any of the parks. Mr. Harry Easterling, Jr. clarified that the only landscaping done was at McColl and was done as a boy scout project.

Mr. Gladden questioned where the information was that Dr. Prince had requested at the last meeting regarding the ball fields, layouts, etc. He said he needed numbers, he has people ready to donate. Mr. Gladden stated he had a \$50,000 grant for a walking trail. He has all the information which needs to be sent off. He stated there is another \$50,000 available in October. He stated he wanted the Grand-opening now, he does not want to wait until August. Mr. Kimrey advised council needs to approve whatever is going to be done. Mr. Munnerlyn stated the committee needed to meet. Mr. Woods agreed. Mr. Munnerlyn advised Mr. Gladden he needed to get with staff concerning the grants.

Mr. Jason Steen – questioned the status of the old library. Mr. Kimrey advised there were no bids received. The engineer stated the building was unsafe. It was questioned concerning the liability to the county if it is given away. Mr. Harry Easterling, Jr. advised the liability could be contracted away. Mr. Ron Munnerlyn, Council Chair

advised it would be put back on the agenda for the next council meeting and requested the appropriate committee meet and bring a recommendation back to council at the next meeting.

Ms. Corrie Plato – no comments.

Mr. Anthony Woods – no comments.

Ron Munnerlyn, Chairman – wanted to thank Mr. Steen, Mr. Allen, Mr. Woods, and Mr. Kimrey for representing the county at the Tri-county meeting.

Mr. Munnerlyn advised Mr. Kimrey had requested the redistricting information and council would work on it as soon as the information came in.

He stated there was an issue with the County Transportation Paving Committee which he wanted to bring to everyone's attention. He advised the committee had met again earlier in the evening and voted not to give the county funds for crush & run without a county match. The county had requested the CTC give the crush & run without a match for the dirt roads in the county which a lot of citizens live on. The CTC refused. The county sent a letter requesting they reconsider, in which they have voted again to uphold what they had originally decided. Mr. Munnerlyn stated the CTC has made a lot of negative remarks about Marlboro County Council. The Committee is to represent the public, they are appointed by the Legislative Delegation. He stated the committee is not representing the citizens of the county if they are questioning the county's intent to maintain the dirt roads.

Mr. Ken Allen stated another issue is citizens coming to council to request crush and run and paving of roads. He stated the county does not pave roads or put the rocks on them unless we have them. He suggested the citizens need to attend the County Transportation Committee meetings and make their requests.

Mr. Willie Gladden suggested council reach out to the Legislative Delegation and request assistance from them.

Mr. Munnerlyn recommended all the council members think about the situation and it would be discussed at the next council meeting.

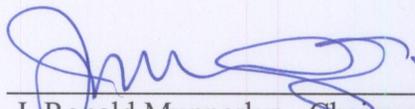
No items were discussed.

No further discussion was heard. The meeting was adjourned

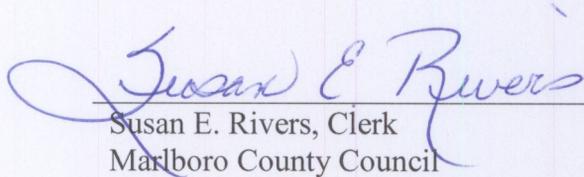
