I, Amy Clark Bolden, the wife of Frank Bolden, of the City of Columbia, County of Richland, and State aforesaid, being of sound mind, memory, and understanding, but mindful of the uncertainty of human life, do make, publish, and declare this to be my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking any Will or Wills be me at any time heretofore made.

Item 1. I desire that all of my just debts and funeral expenses be paid by my Executor hereinafter named, as soon after my decease as practicable.

Item 11. I hereby give, devise, and bequeath unto my daughter, Jennie Weeks, the wife of William Weeks, and my son, William Clark, and my daughter, Daisy Carter, formerly the wife of ~~Lafayette~~ Carter, all of whom now reside in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, being the children of myself and my first husband, William Clark, who died, intestate, in the City of Columbia, many years ago; all my right, title, interest and estate, as the widow of the said William Clark, or otherwise, of, in, and to the Eastern half of the large lot of land on the Northern side of the extension of Washington Street, in the City of Columbia, conveyed unto him by Sims Glisson by his deed of Conveyance of the entire lot to the said William Clark, dated 11th January, A. D. 1871, and recorded in the Clerk's office, of said County, in Book "F" of Deeds, page 288, whereon I now reside with my present husband, Frank Bolden.

The above devise of my interest in the said house and lot is subject nevertheless, to the right and privilege of my husband, the said Frank Bolden, to continue to reside there as his home, for and during the remainder of his natural life, and at his death, the said privilege terminates.

Daisy Clarke Carter, being first duly sworn, says:

That she is the daughter of William Clarke and Amy Clarke, who formerly resided in the City of Columbia, S. C. on a piece of property on the extension of Washington Street owned by William Clarke; that the said William Clarke died intestate in the year _____ leaving as his sole heirs at law his wife, Amy Clarke, and his children, Jennie Weeks, Daisy Carter (deponent), and William Clarke.

That Amy Clarke thereafter remarried one Frank Bolden who died in the year 1927. That Amy Clarke Bolden died in the year 1932 leaving a last will and testament dated May 9, 1927 wherein she devised all of her right, title and interest "as the widow of the said William Clark, or otherwise, of, in, and to the eastern half of the large lot of land on the northern side of the extension of Washington Street, in the City of Columbia, conveyed unto him by Sims Glisson by his deed of conveyance of the entire lot to the said William Clark, dated 11th January, A.D. 1871, and recorded in the Clerk's office, of said County, in Book F of Deed, page 288" unto Jennie Weeks, William Clark, and Daisy Carter. That through some oversight this will was never recorded and the original cannot now be found, although deponent has a copy. That the devisees named in the said will, namely, Jennie Weeks, William Clark, and Daisy Carter, are the sole heirs at law of Amy Clark Bolden.
