



HURRICANE MATTHEW
INFORMATION FOR SOUTH CAROLINA

Hurricane Matthew is expected to remain a dangerous, powerful hurricane.

Tropical storm or hurricane conditions could affect South Carolina later this week or this weekend, even if the center of Matthew remains offshore.

The storm's uncertain path is precisely the reason to start emergency preparations.

Now is the time to review your emergency plans & know what to do if local officials recommend safety precautions.

Hurricane predictions can change quickly. Continue to check official forecasts from the National Hurricane Center and information from SCEMD.
