SUMMARY REPORT

Meeting of Commission on Higher Education, October 6, 1983

Johnson & Wales College, Providence, Rhode Island, has operated a program in culinary arts for military personnel in Charleston and Beaufort since 1981. The college applied for licensure, under Act 201 of 1977 (Licensing of Non-public Educational Institutions to Confer Degrees), to offer its program to civilians in the Charleston area. The Commission voted to grant Johnson & Wales College a regular license to operate at the associate degree level, subject to renewal every five years and annual reporting of information as requested by the Commission.

The Commission authorized the Committee on Academic Affairs to approve a team of consultants to review existing degree programs at baccalaureate and higher levels in the field of history.

The Commission received as information a report on allocation of 1984-85 appropriations to the colleges and universities.

Mr. Robert E. Roberson, System Vice President for Computer Services at the University of South Carolina, reported on the need for computers in higher education.

The Commission approved a request from Clemson University to acquire a prefabricated modular unit to be used as a temporary east campus convenience facility. Students living in east campus apartments will be able to purchase food and miscellaneous supplies at the facility.

The Commission received as information a report on the September 14 meeting of the Joint Health and Medical Education Board.

The Commission approved the State's response to the U.S. Department of Education's August 26, 1983, evaluation report on South Carolina's 1981-82 higher education desegregation efforts.
