Thank you for sharing your concerns in regards to the prices at Edisto Beach State Park. The South Carolina State Park service has been challenged to reach 100% self-sufficiency, because of this we have implemented a new dynamic pricing structure at some of our parks. Edisto Beach has recently been added as dynamic pricing park. You will see that the prices during higher demand periods will be higher, however when demand is lower you will find the prices to be lower than they have been in the past.

\$50 is the current rate for a standard campsite in the Beachfront Campground. Lower rates are available in the Live Oak Campground, as well as our Rustic Tent sites which remain \$20. Please know that all rates are subject to change. I assure you it is not our intent to cause a financial burden on any of our park visitors. I hope this information is beneficial and has helped to explain our dynamic pricing structure. Again, I would like to thank you for sharing your concerns with us, for it is through visitors feedback that we can best monitor our level of service.
