From creating 3D printers to accelerating startups, the industry of innovation is moving swiftly in South Carolina, and our focus on creating a robust high-tech and entrepreneurial environment is beginning to cause a digital shift. The technology business magazine *Fast Company* has given Charleston the moniker "Silicon Harbor," ranking the Holy City as one of the top 10 fastest-growing cities for software and internet technology. Additionally, with Columbia and Greenville expanding their digital universe, a report from the Bay Area Council Economic Institute ranked South Carolina the number two state for high-tech employment growth in the nation. A separate report from the University of Nebraska released last month showed that South Carolina surged 27 spots on an annual entrepreneurship state ranking.

Innovation is creativity at work, and we want to make sure innovation is at work in our state. This week, Commerce's Office of Innovation issued the second [South Carolina Innovation Challenge](#). The Challenge is open statewide and offers up to \$2 million in competitive grant funding for programs that aim to grow the state's high-tech and entrepreneurial economic development efforts.

The advancement of innovation is important to South Carolina's economic future. And it is vital that we nurture that spark and support the talented innovators and inventors living within our borders, which will mean great things for the future of business here in South Carolina.

In June, **General Electric** announced the construction of a new state-of-the-art **Power & Water advanced manufacturing** built in Greenville, SC.
