M I N U T E S

Mr. Poore called the meeting to order and Mr. Wiles gave the invocation.

On the motion of Mr. Rhodes, seconded by Mr. Hooper, Council voted unanimously to approve the minutes of the September 18, 1979, meeting as mailed.

Mr. Jim Crosby of Craytonville addressed Council for a solution to a road problem where a section of road becomes flooded during heavy rains. Mr. Poore directed the County Engineer, Mac Walters, to contact the State Highway Department concerning S.C. Highway 20 and Gunnells Road for a solution to the problem. He also asked Mr. Crosby to seek easements from neighbors to cross their property in order to divert excess water from flooded area.

Mr. Thomas Pelfrey asked if property shown on plat 119, Carlen Drive belonged to the County. Mr. Pelfrey is interested in building a home on the land. Mr. Poore suggested Mr. Pelfrey to check the deeds in the Clerk of Court's Office and informed him that county property is sold only by public auction.

Mr. Poore discussed a request from Mr. J. C. Ward to preach from a boat at Broadway Lake, which is owned by the County. The request was referred to Mr. Carlisle Thompson, chairman of the Broadway Lake Commission, and the request was granted.

Mr. Joel Jones, chairman of the Anderson County Emergency Medical Services Commission, commented on a request made by Mr. Frank Allison at the last Council meeting. He stated that the squads receive more than \$10,000 worth of equipment, employees insurance, radio equipment maintenance, advanced life support, medical supplies and a dispatcher's salary from the County which he considers adequate at this time.

Mr. Robert P. Lusk presented Council a resolution that would create a Solid Waste engineering and economic study committee. On the motion of Mr. Wright, seconded by Mr. Hooper, Council voted unanimously to reject the resolution and to notify the Appalachian Resource Committee.

Council asked Mr. Trey Senn to conduct a study and report back in two (2) months on the feasibility of requiring advance approval for new buildings in the County to prevent drainage problems.
