BILL BACKGROUND:

- In 2014, federal legislation entitled the Choice Act expanded the use of certain tuition assistance benefits to military dependents.
- This legislation requires states to allow beneficiaries of veteran-related education benefits to receive in-state tuition rates and allows for penalties on other federal education benefits should states not comply with this provision.
- This bill allows for in-state tuition for military personnel and their dependents while they are beneficiaries of military-related education benefits, bringing the state into compliance with federal provisions.
- Universities and colleges indicate this could result in an other funds fiscal impact of \$14.7 million by lowering tuition rates for individuals currently paying out-of-state tuition.
- CHE estimates the fiscal impact of not complying with this provision could result in losses to state colleges and universities upwards of \$50 million.
- The senate budget provides for a \$10 million non-recurring offset for this fiscal impact.
- Passed Senate (44-0), House (98-0).
