

Army Families To Move Into Housing Units

100 Apartments to Be Ready Monday; Civilians Still File Applications

Gonzales Gardens, 236-unit cost housing project constructed across Forest drive from the Providence hospital, will be opened to non-commissioned officers and privates of Fort Jackson Monday.

William R. Geddings, supervising manager of the three projects here, said that the 100 units allotted to the soldiers stationed at the fort would be available to them Monday morning.

Date for the civilians to move into the other 136 units has not been fixed, he said. Applications for units are still being received.

The 100 units were allotted to the non-commissioned officers and privates by the Columbia Housing authority.

Mr. Geddings explained today that he would move his office from University Terrace to Gonzales Gardens within the next few days.

Rentals for the units at Gonzales Gardens ranges from \$7.65 a month to \$16.75 a month. This includes an electric refrigerator, a gas stove, electricity and gas and an oil heater. Tenants must buy the oil to use for heating purposes.
