Your local SC Works Center is an invaluable tool that provides free resources to help you attract, hire and train the workers your business needs to succeed.

Finding the right employee can be a challenging task. Through your local center you can post your job listing to a statewide database, find out about recruitment events and job fairs, and even use professional staff to organize and promote a specialized hiring event. Once you have found the right fit, local centers also provide you access to information about community resources and training opportunities.

How to appeal a claim

When an individual files for unemployment benefits, the S.C. Department of Employment and Workforce (DEW) investigates the claim by contacting both the individual and the individual's former employer. The department then issues a written determination detailing its initial ruling on the individual's eligibility for benefits and any points of law considered. You have the right to file an appeal if you disagree with the determination. Each determination letter contains detailed appeal rights and information; make sure to read this

Preparing for a Field Audit

From time to time, the Department of Employment and Workforce will conduct a field audit. The purpose of an audit includes:

- Determining taxable wages the employer paid and the contributions, interest, and penalties DEW law requires on these wages.
- Reconciling wages reported with amounts discovered.
- Determining the employer's financial ability to meet UI tax obligations.
