My, what sharp teeth you have! The American Alligator is one of the most fascinating reptiles found in North America. Historically hunted close to extinction for their hide, alligators have made a remarkable comeback across freshwater ecosystems in the Southeastern U.S. In its juvenile stage, young alligators have alternating bands of black and yellow on their skin to aid in camouflaging from predators such as herons, egrets and even other alligators! Though “cute” as juveniles, adults can weigh up to 800 lbs and grow to lengths of 11-13 feet long depending on gender.
