The Elton John AIDS Foundation (EJAF) recognizes that to build an effective and enduring response to the HIV/AIDS epidemic we must train, mentor, and support young and emerging leaders and advocates.

As part of the Foundation's 2015 grant-making program, EJAF awarded more than \$1.5 million in grants to 15 organizations mentoring and supporting the leaders of today, training them to become the leaders of tomorrow.



In the U.S., 26% of all new HIV infections occur in young people age 13-24, which translates into one teen or young adult becoming infected with HIV every hour of every day. Still, many young people don't believe they are at risk. Supporting young people to be informed and experienced in speaking up for the programs and services they need to stay healthy has been an EJAF priority for many years.
