

Mack recognized by S.C. seedsmen

During the 62nd annual meeting of the South Carolina Seedsmen's Association, E. Wayne Mack, Director of Marketing and Promotion at the South Carolina Department of Agriculture, was recognized for his significant contributions to the seed industry in the state. At their banquet on Monday, July 19, Mack was presented an Honorary Membership for his marketing efforts in encouraging the use and demand for South Carolina seeds, especially in the area of vegetables.

Mack said, "I am proud of this recognition, especially since in past years this award has been bestowed to those directly involved in the seed industry. I have been honored to work with them in the marketing of agricultural products. The more demand for agricultural products, the more demand for seeds."

Mack, a native of St. Matthews, S.C., attended the University of South Carolina majoring in Business Administration and Marketing. As a 25-year veteran of the Department of Agriculture, he has worked in Market News and Inspection, International Marketing, and Domestic Market Development. He has also served as Executive Director of various commodity boards and is a member of several local and national organizations relating to Agricultural Marketing. Mack and his wife have two children and one granddaughter.

The South Carolina Seedsmen's Association is a trade organization of about 150 members from all areas of the seed industry — production, packaging, distribution, and retailing. Members work closely together to ensure that South Carolina farmers and gardeners receive the best quality seeds available for everything from soybeans and cotton to vegetables and flowers. Quality seeds have made the difference between survival and disaster since the early settlers planted their first crops.

The South Carolina Seedsmen's Association is an affiliate of the American Seed Trade Association, an organization which monitors regulatory and legislative matters and new technologies impacting the seed industry.

FFA Earns Cash for Culture

Through the sale of S.C. Art and Agriculture Watercolor Collection calendars for the year 2000, FFA has a chance to earn "cash for culture," —agriculture, that is. FFA members have joined forces with the Friends of Agriculture (FOA) to increase awareness of agriculture in the state, and, at the same time, support high school and college students preparing for careers in the science, business, or technology of agriculture and related areas.

To build an understanding of the continuing importance of agriculture to our way of life, the FOA implemented an ag awareness campaign in 1997. Since then, the campaign has included television spots, billboards, bumper stickers, caps, and other

premium items, all designed to educate the increasingly urban population about the critical contributions agriculture makes to our well-being. FFA members have been an important part of the annual FOA campaign launch events, and now they have a chance to participate in the calendar effort, too. The project will add cash and culture to the organizations' efforts.

Thirty-six original paintings depicting agriculture have been donated by well-known S.C. watercolor artists over a three-year period for the S.C. Department of Agriculture's permanent Art and Agriculture Watercolor Collection. Each year, the SCDA allows the FOA to produce the Art and Agriculture Watercolor Calendar from the paintings in the collection. Artists for the Art and Agriculture Watercolor Calendar 2000 include: Dixie Dugan-Myrtle Beach; Jennie Branham-Chapin; Lorin Mason-Pawleys Island; Anna K. Singley-Prosperity; Barbara Yon-Ridge Spring; and Laura Dickson, Bonnie Smith, Betty Kornegay, Debbie Sherer, Fran Solomon, Niles Storrs, and Jackie Vining-Price-Columbia.

The calendars sell for \$10 each. Out of the \$10, three dollars will be retained by the FFA Chapter, and the rest will go to the FOA to continue the on-going ag awareness campaign that is already underway and for the cost of printing the calendars. For every calendar that FFA members sell, an additional dollar is being reserved for an FFA scholarship fund. In other words, if the FFA sells 5,000 calendars at \$10 each, the organization will not only receive \$15,000 for the effort, but also \$5,000 for a scholarship or scholarships.

FFA members are out pre-selling the calendars which should be ready for distribution to buyers in late August. They make great gifts for family and friends and great promotional items for agribusinesses.

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Commissioner's Column

Inside politics — for a week

This spring, local American Legion members visited schools across the state searching for some of our brightest students. Why? To give them an inside scoop into how our government works.

Most high school students know little about what kind of work their city council members, state representatives, senators and constitutional officers perform on a day-to-day basis, and even fewer know about the political intricacies that go along with those public offices. But each spring hundreds of teenagers have the opportunity to briefly peek into the world of politics and learn a little bit more about our complex political processes.

About 1,300 teenagers participated in the Boys State/Girls State program, which is organized by local American Legions and American Legion Auxiliaries across the state. Teens who participate in the program are divided into 15 "cities" and spend a week getting first-hand governing experience. They campaign. They make speeches. They vote. They sit on mock city and county councils, listen to their constituents and draft ordinances. Some serve as state representatives, senators and all nine constitutional officers. Teens who are uninterested in becoming politicians for a week become the reporters who interview the politicians and tell the general public what their representatives are doing. And they do all this in one short week.

This year, 790 guys bunked in the barracks at the Citadel, and 450 girls stayed in dorms at Columbia College for their week-long foray into politics. They worked their way up to various levels of government during the week, beginning with city government, then learning about county and finally state government. Toward the end of the week, the students voted on who they thought should represent them as state senators, representatives and constitutional office-holders. They even had two political parties during the campaigns — the federalists and the nationalists. After the final votes were counted and officers elected, the young men and women headed to the State Capitol to meet their adult counterparts and finish out a week absolutely loaded with hands-on politicking.

When the students ventured to the Capitol, I had the pleasure of meeting two especially bright teens, Laci Chisholm and Johnny Graham. Laci attends Northwestern High School in Rock Hill, and Johnny attends Berea High School in Greenville. The two were elected Commissioners of Agriculture by their fellow boy and girl staters, and both were very excited about the things they learned.

Seventeen-year-old Laci said she enjoyed her week at Columbia College, meeting other students her age and working on her campaign.

"I got to learn a lot about constitutional offices that I didn't know before," she said. "I became confident in what I was saying. I got to meet senators and prominent leaders, especially women that are involved in politics."

Johnny, who is also 17, said he was surprised by all the opportunities the Boys State program offered.

"I'd never heard of Boys State," he said. "I was thinking I would go down there and sit in a bunch of classes, but it was non-stop — we were doing stuff all the time."

He said he enjoyed the political rallies and that he learned a lot about speech-making.

"I found I need to be myself and still make a point," in my speeches, he said.

Boys State/Girls State has been around since 1940, and South Carolina's program is unique because it's run by former boy staters. Twelfth Circuit Family Court Judge A.E. Morehead, who has been involved with the program for 37 years, said organizers try to make the program a kind of laboratory of government for teens.

"We try to make it as realistic as we can," Judge Morehead said.

The youth who participate in the program get a great head-start in politics. Even those who may never enter the political arena themselves learn invaluable lessons on how to get things done through government. When they return home after Boys State/Girls State, they return equipped with knowledge on how to get their roads repaired and how to petition their representatives. This information is
