Chandra Dillard, Rick Danner and Terence Roberts Receive Regional Awards at Celebrating Successes Brunch

During Ten at the Top's Celebrating Successes Brunch on Wednesday, November 14, South Carolina State

Representative Chandra Dillard, City of Greer Mayor Rick Danner and City of Anderson Mayor Terence Roberts were recognized for their record of servant leadership and contributions to enhancing the Upstate region. Dillard received the Burdette Leadership Award while Danner and Roberts were recognized with the Welling Award for Regional Collaboration.

This marks the third year of the Burdette Leadership Award and is given in recognition of Carol Burdette, the first female chair of Ten at the Top. It honors women who have both served and led across the Upstate. Previous recipients of the Burdette Award are Minor Shaw and Dr. Becky Campbell.

The Welling Award for Regional Collaboration, named after Ten at the Top founding chairman Irv Welling, recognizes individuals who have demonstrated longstanding involvement in encouraging collaboration across jurisdictional and stakeholder boundaries. Previous recipients of the Welling Award include Erwin Maddrey, Phil Hughes, GSP International Airport, Dean Hybl, Minor Shaw, Carol Burdette and Bobby Hitt.

Town of Ninety-Six and Charles Townes Arts & Technology Experiment Receive Hughes Investments Elevate Upstate Community Vibrancy Grants

As part of the Celebrating Successes Brunch on November 14th, Ten at the Top announced the recipients for the 2018 Hughes Investments Elevate Upstate Community Vibrancy Grants. The two recipients, each receiving \$5,000, are the Ninety-Six Mill Village Association for their Movie Night at the Park project and Spontaneous Productions for the First Annual Charles Townes Arts & Technology Experiment.

The grants, which began in 2013, annually provide "seed funds" to support vibrancy initiatives in communities across the Upstate region. There were 26 applications for the 2018 grants and five finalists gave brief presentations before the selections were made during the Celebrating Successes Brunch presented by Piedmont Natural Gas on Wednesday, November 14, at the Greenville Marriott as part of the Our Upstate Vision Forum Series presented by BlueCross BlueShield of South Carolina.

"The goal of the Elevate Upstate program is to get communities thinking about what types of initiatives or

programs might help spark vibrancy within their area and then provide some seed money to get some of them started," said Hughes Investments President Phil Hughes. "In the six years we have done this program, I have been amazed by the great ideas and passion of communities across the region to grow their vibrancy and sense of place. It was a real challenge to narrow the field to five finalists and to select the recipients."

In addition to providing \$10,000 to the two winners, Hughes also pledged a \$3,000 matching grant to the Piedmont Physic Garden in Union County to start an Environmental Arts Festival.

In the six years of the Hughes Investments Elevate Upstate Grants program, Phil Hughes and Hughes Investments has provided a total of \$80,000 to help with 24 different vibrancy initiatives across the Upstate region.

Kauffman Foundation Representative Says Entrepreneurs & Small Businesses Play Critical Role in Economic Success

the larger companies such as BMW, Michelin, Bosch, Milliken and others with lots of employees and established brands and histories.

Yet, did you know that 89% of the businesses in the United States employ 20 or fewer employees?

According to Andy Stoll from the Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation in Kansas City, the places that will thrive economically in today's "Connected Age" are those that can best enable entrepreneurs and small businesses to grow and achieve success.

While that certainly includes creating and identifying the various resources needed by entrepreneurs, Stoll said that also means purposefully creating a culture where all potential entrepreneurs and small business owners are aware of and have access to what they need to be successful.

"Many communities have the ingredients that entrepreneurs need," Stoll said, "they just may not be organized in a way that is supportive."

Stoll, a senior program officer for the Kauffman Foundation who has started six entrepreneurial-focused organizations, made those comments during a recent two-day visit to the Upstate. During his trip, Stoll met with local entrepreneurs and toured some of the great incubators and entrepreneurial support locations in the region including NEXT in Greenville, BGEN in Gaffney and the Tri-Country Entrepreneurial Development Center in Walhalla.

He also spoke at a luncheon in Spartanburg hosted by the Spartanburg Area Chamber of Commerce, Johnson Group, VentureSouth and VentureCarolina and conducted a workshop for about 30 entrepreneurs and entrepreneur support providers as part of Ten at the Top's Entrepreneur Support Providers Network.

"The Upstate is ahead of many other places in looking at ecosystem building," Stoll said. "That you already have people coming together to see how they can work collaboratively and enhance opportunities for entrepreneurs is vital."
