Consideration of the Ratings for Performance Year 2000-01 to Impact FY 2001-02

On May 22, 2001, the Planning and Assessment Committee met to consider staff recommendations for institutional performance ratings for 2000-01 to impact FY 2001-02 allocation of state appropriations. The Committee approved without exception staff's recommendations for consideration of the Commission. Please refer to the materials received for the May 22nd Planning and Assessment Committee Meeting for copies of the recommendations. These materials are also available on the Commissions website http://www.che400.state.sc.us/web/Perform/Agenda-Minutes/agenda_frames.htm.

The Committee's recommendations represent the culmination of a rating process that involves staff collecting and analyzing performance data to determine scores based on approved standards; providing preliminary recommendations based on the aforementioned staff analysis to institutions to allow a period for institutional review and comment; and submitting resulting score recommendations and analysis of any appeals made for special cases for consideration of the Planning and Assessment Committee. This year, preliminary staff recommendations were distributed to the state's colleges and universities on April 12, 2001. Institutions were asked to respond in writing, with adequate supporting documentation, by April 25 if they wished to address special concerns before the Planning and Assessment Committee on May 22. Four institutions submitted written concerns addressing 7 issues across them. In comparison to past years, 8 institutions raised 18 concerns last year and 26 raised 85 issues the year before. For the 7 issues raised, staff recommended to the Committee that 2 cases result in scoring exceptions. Additionally, after the release of the preliminary recommendations, staff also responded to several issues raised either internally or externally from institutions as scores and data were reviewed that resulted in data corrections across 22 institutions and 30 data points. Of these, only 9 resulted in revised scoring recommendations based on the comparison of corrected data to approved standard. Staff's resulting recommendations were distributed May 15. On May 22, the Planning and Assessment Committee, after allowing for comment and discussion, considered and approved without exception the recommendations for Commission consideration on June 7. It is noted that institutions that had appealed recommendations expressed to the Committee satisfaction with staff's analysis and recommendations and did not request any further consideration. The Committee expresses its appreciation to institutions for their continued support and cooperation in this process.

The recommended ratings for the 2000-01 Performance Year reflect an average score for all institutions of 82% (2.47 of 3). In all, 17 of 33 institutions were rated as performing in the "Achieves" category and the remaining 16 institutions were rated as performing in the "Exceeds" category. The 2000-01 recommended ratings are similar to past years. In comparison, for 1999-2000 scores impacting FY2000-01, the average score was 84% (2.53 of 3) with 22 performing in the "Achieves" category and 11 performing in the "Exceeds" category and for 1998-99 scores impacting FY 1999-00, the average score was 86% (2.57 of 3), with 15 institutions performing in the "Achieves" category and 18 performing in the "Exceeds" category. This past year the Commission adopted common standards for institutions within sectors based on national, state or peer data as available. Prior to this past year and for the past two years, individualized benchmark standards in combination with sector standards for some indicators were used in assessing performance.

Committee Recommendation: The Planning and Assessment Committee recommends that the Commission approve the performance ratings as approved by the Committee at its May 22, 2001, meeting for the performance year 2000-01 to impact FY 2001-02 allocations.

"Performance Funding" in SC began with the ratification of Act 359 of 1996, effective July 1, 1996, which required that the SC Commission on Higher Education (CHE) measure annually each public institution's performance in various areas and allocate state appropriated dollars based on performance. Each year, the CHE in cooperation with institutions and other stakeholders has worked to refine the system implemented in 1996 in an effort to ensure and improve the quality of SC's public colleges and universities so they will be globally competitive. Data and scores for indicators used for purposes of allocating FY 2001-02 dollars follow. Yearly revisions and differences across and within sectors make comparisons across performance years and institutions difficult. For a better understanding, please see our website at www.che400.state.sc.us where a detailed guide to the system and measurement (see Performance Funding Workbook, Sept 2000) and data details may be accessed.

DATA and SCORING KEY: Below are performance details for each performance indicator as measured in Performance Year 2000-01, including: the measurement timeframe for this year's performance, historical and current performance data, the standard used in judging current year performance, and subpart and overall indicator scores. In July 2000, the CHE set standards for indicators for similar institutions based on national, regional or state data; data from peer institutions or past institutional performance. For the majority of indicators, performance is judged using a 3-point scale and comparing it to the standard, which is expressed as a range. A score of "2" is awarded if an institution is at or within the range. Performance exceeding the range in a desired direction merits a "3" while performance falling short of the range receives a "1." Additionally, 0.5 points may be added to scores of 1 or 2 for some indicators if performance reaches or exceeds a certain level of improvement over past performance. Performance on other indicators is judged by determining compliance with policies or practices. Compliance is expected and a score of 1 is given for non-compliance. In limited cases, the CHE may award scores based on analysis of an institutional appeal requesting special consideration. To determine overall performance (summarized on page 1 and at the end of this report), scores displayed for each indicator in the far right column are averaged: the average places the institution in 1 of 5 performance categories, and funding is allocated based on the category, not the individual score or average.

"Performance Funding" in SC began with the ratification of Act 359 of 1996, effective July 1, 1996, which required that the SC Commission on Higher Education (CHE) measure annually each public institution's performance in various areas and allocation state appropriated dollars based on performance. Each year, the CHE in cooperation with institutions and other stakeholders has worked to refine the system implemented in 1996 in an effort to ensure and improve the quality of SC's public colleges and universities so they will be globally competitive. In July 2000, the CHE set standards for indicators for similar institutions based on national, regional or state data; data from peer institutions or past institutional performance. For the majority of indicators, performance is judged using a 3-point scale and comparing it to the standard, which is expressed as a range. A score of "2" is awarded if an institution is at or within the range. Performance exceeding the range in a desired direction merits a "3," while performance falling short of the range receives a "1." Additionally, 0.5 points may be added to scores of 1 or 2 for some indicators. If performance reaches or exceeds a certain level of improvement over past performance, performance on other indicators is judged by determining compliance with policies or practices. Compliance is expected and a score of 1 is given for non-compliance. In limited cases, the CHE may award analysis of an institutional appeal requesting special consideration. To determine overall performance (summarized on page 1 and at the end of this report), scores displayed for each indicator in the far right column are averaged; the average places the institution in 1 of 5 performance categories; and funding is allocated based on the category, not the individual score or average.

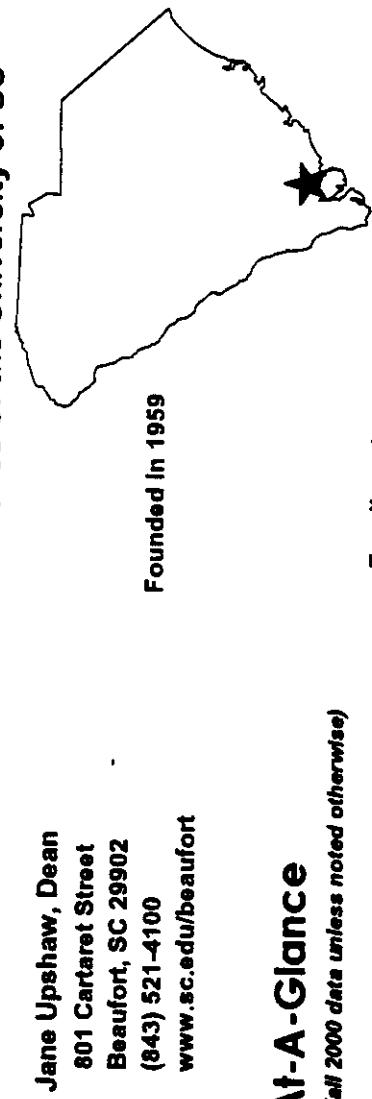

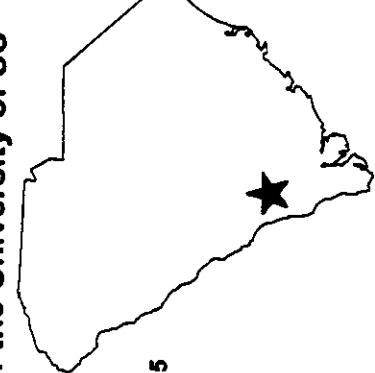

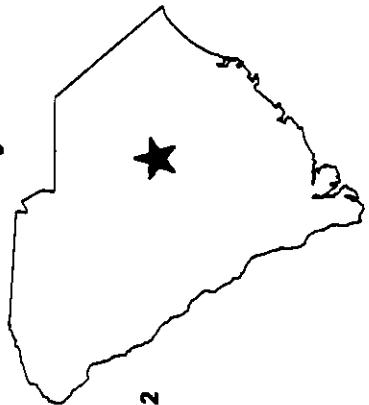

Each year, the CHE in cooperation with institutions and other stakeholders has worked to refine the system implemented in 1996 in an effort to ensure and improve the quality of SC's public colleges and universities so they will be globally competitive. 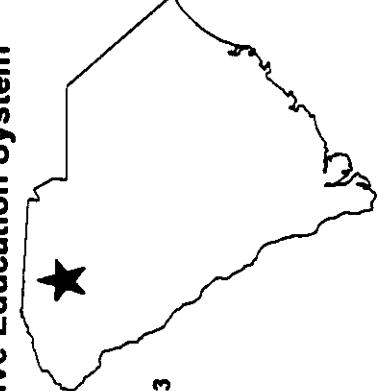
