WASHINGTON (AP) — Scranton isn't a standard stop on the Democratic fundraising circuit. Yet Hillary Clinton put the class Pennsylvania town on her itinerary — several times. The Democratic presidential nominee and her family have made multiple visits to Scranton donors since launching her campaign last August, raising millions of dollars in a former industrial town known for needing economic aid rather than giving it out.

[WHY IT MATTERS: Opioid epidemic](#)

CONCORD, N.H. (AP) — THE ISSUE: More Americans are dying from opioids than at any time in recent history, with deaths hitting a peak of 28,000 in 2014. That amounts to 78 Americans dying from an opioid overdose every day, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The CDC uses opioid as an umbrella term for synthetic painkillers derived naturally from opium (known more specifically as opiates), such as heroin.
