Also, the markets will be brimming with gourds, ornamental corn, and other products to help create wonderful Halloween displays as well as fresh, locally-grown fall produce. And, since the children will be jumping for Jack-O-Lanterns by then, there will be plenty of pumpkins as well as plants for all to enjoy everywhere on the markets.

The Midlands Fall Plant and Flower Festival will be held Friday-Sunday, October 20-22, 2000, at the Columbia State Farmers Market, 1001 Bluff Rd. in Columbia.

Joint Field Day for Pecan Growers in the Carolinas

The first joint NC/SC Carolina Pecan Growers' Field Day will be held in the orchards of Chesterfield County, SC, and just "across-the-border" in Anson County, N.C, on Saturday, September 23, 2000.

The "across-the-border" effort is sponsored by the North Carolina Pecan Growers Association. Clemson University and North Carolina State University will provide a daylong educational program consisting of in-orchard demonstrations of effective management strategies throughout the life of pecan trees. The first stop will be at the orchard of Mike Goodwin on Raney Rd. in Chesterfield, SC, to see his 6 to 8-year-old trees. The other stop will be at the orchard of Anne Goodwin on Stanbach Rd., Lilesville, NC, in Anson County to see an older stand of pecan trees. Participants will travel together from the first site to the next.

Kent Anderson, buyer for Young Pecan Company in Florence, SC, will join others for the informal program. Anderson is a loyal supporter of pecan growers in North and South Carolina as well as the entire pecan industry worldwide.

Registration for the NC/SC "borderless" Pecan Growers Field Day, which includes a catered lunch between orchard visits, begins at 9:30 AM. The Pecan Growers Field Day is free and open not only to veteran and novice pecan growers, but to anyone in the Carolinas interested in becoming a pecan grower. Fighting fire with fire? Absolutely not!

"Fire ants! Everybody hates them! Everybody wants to kill them!" says Dr. Bob Bellinger, Clemson Extension pesticide coordinator.

We're all looking for ways to rid our lawns and gardens of fire ants. According to Dr. Bellinger, people use everything from grits to gas to get rid of the pests. The idea is that the ants eat the grits, drink water, and then blow up. He says, "The truth is that ants don't eat grits. Fire ants don't eat solid food at all, nor can they chew."

Then, there is the so-called gasoline remedy. People pour gas down the fire ant mound and light it. But, if you do that, you might wind up with more "fire" than you do "fire ants." Gas is not only a fire hazard, but it could run off into the groundwater. Some people use these home remedies because they think that pesticides are too dangerous. Dr. Bellinger says, "When used properly, pesticides are far safer. Just read and follow the label directions exactly." So, just say "NO!" to those old-fashioned fire ant remedies. For help in controlling fire ants safely, call your local Clemson Extension Service listed in your telephone directory.

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Commissioner's Column

National Food Safety Education Month

Food safety and nutrition awareness are now a part of our everyday lives---and so are misperceptions about "good" and "bad" foods.

The Food Guide Pyramid provides guidance on eating a healthy, balanced, and varied diet. Daily physical activity is also vital for a healthy lifestyle. Misperceptions about a healthy diet have made many feel guilty about eating certain foods. In fact, they're missing some valuable nutrients from not using a well-balanced diet. Balance is always the best guide.

How about food safety? I hear some of you saying, "Well, I've eaten the same things prepared the same way for years, and I haven't had a foodborne illness." Scientists say many who have had flu-like symptoms might actually have had a foodborne illness from bacteria or other pathogens in food that is not prepared or handled properly. According to The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, foodborne illnesses in the United States affect millions of people every year. In fact, an estimated 800,000 of those illnesses occur in children under the age of 10.

Even though we do have some cases of foodborne illnesses, the American food supply is still the safest in the world. Because our food is strictly monitored all the way from the farm to the supermarket and because we have more and better detection methods today, many detrimental pathogens are caught before they can do any harm. In fact, the SC Food Safety Council, established in 1996 and officially recognized just this year, is a cooperative effort of public and private organizations to combine resources for food safety in the state.

The council consists of about 50 representatives involved in food safety from Clemson University, SC Department of Health and Environmental Control, SC Department of Education, Medical University of South Carolina, USDA-FSIS, State Veterinarian's Office, and the SC Department of Agriculture. Also representing the private sector are Ryan's, BI-LO, Sara Lee, the SC Cattlemen's Association, and the SC Hospitality Association. This group has pooled resources and developed ways to communicate safe food handling practices to both the foodservice industry and the consuming public. For example, Jim Rushing and Libby Hoyle of Clemson University have received a grant to create an educational program on food safety. I commend each of these individuals for making food safety a priority in this state.

In addition to the efforts of public and private organizations, our farmers also work hard to make sure that their products remain safe from the farm to their final destination. But, food safety *really* begins at home. Foodborne illnesses are primarily the result of improper handling and food preparation, *not the farm product itself*.

September is **National Food Safety Education Month**, an annual observance created by the foodservice industry to focus attention on the importance of safe food handling and preparation in both home and commercial kitchens. This year's theme, *Be Smart. Keep Foods Apart---Don't Cross-Contaminate*, focuses on the transfer of harmful bacteria to food from other foods, cutting boards, utensils, etc. if they are not handled properly.

To avoid cross-contamination, always wash hands with hot, soapy water after handling any raw food. Wash cutting boards, dishes, and utensils with hot, soapy water after they come in contact with raw products. Keep raw products and the juices from raw foods away from other foods in the shopping cart, on kitchen counters, and in your refrigerator. If possible, use one cutting board for fresh produce and a separate one for raw meat, poultry, and seafood. Never place cooked food back on the same plate or cutting board that previously held raw food without washing the plate or cutting board between uses.

Since most people today make the decision on what to have for dinner after 4:30 in the afternoon and most of us spend only 45 minutes or less preparing that meal, food safety is more important than ever. The good news is that there are many things that you and your children can do to help ensure that your food is safe to eat. All you need to do is to handle food properly, practice cleanliness, and maintain the proper temperature for controlling bacteria. When it comes to food safety, let's celebrate National Food Safety Education Month by *Spreading the word... not germs!*
