

Dear Governor Haley:

Having lived in South Carolina since 2008, I would first like to commend you and the fantastic job you have done and are doing for our great state. Mayor Riley met with me and offered several suggestions and I have reached out to Representative Chip Limehouse who has been unable to meet with me so far. When Boeing announced their move to Charleston, I like many others were excited for this opportunity. I have been applying to them since they started advertising and met with one human resource manager but nothing beyond that meeting has occurred.

When you announced recently that South Carolina has produced over 60,000 new jobs, it lifted my spirits. I have lost my home and all my savings since moving here. I have worked hard all my life and have never had trouble finding employment until I moved here. I was even able to change fields seamlessly when I became a single parent and could not travel. When I moved from the medical to the apparel field, I was able to rise quickly and was made vice-president of the division within one year.
