The Commission declined to approve transfers requested by the Commissioner Agriculture involving salary increases for the year 1949-1950.

The Commission declined to approve transfers requested by the State Board of Health for the year 1949-1950 involving:

1. A change in the method of distributing funds for Rural Sanitation and County Health Work.
2. To condense the itemized appropriation for the State Board of Health into ten major divisions. And,
3. To increase the salary of the State Health Officer.

The Commission directed the Secretary to permit State Institutions for whose operation a lump sum appropriation was provided to withdraw sufficient funds from their respective appropriations to establish Revolving Funds, not to exceed 10 per cent of their appropriation, for the year 1949-1950.

The Commission then adjourned.

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
