

To whom it may concern

I Rosemary Quezada am writting from Berkeley County detention center to get a better understanding of the statues of my case. I was arrested by SLED agency on Monday February 8<sup>th</sup> of 2016. I know and understand that Im in their custody, and Im only being housed by the detention centers where I have been placed. Also because of the alleged charge of conspiracy to trafficking heroin it may take awhile before my case is brought to a resolution. Im confused at the fact that I haven't gotten any paperwork from my arrest and I haven't been screen for a lawyer.

Transported to Alvin S. Glenn detention center at Richland County in Colombia, South Carolina on the day of the arrest I was given a two-hundred fifty thousand dollar bond by Judge Newman. Later on I was indicted for the alleged charge of conspiracy to trafficking heroin by Judge Newman on Wednesday May 4<sup>th</sup> of 2016. Transferred by SLED to Berkeley County detention center along with my co-defendents Emory Roberts, Justin Hunter, and Lassan Johnson on Thursday June 9<sup>th</sup> of 2016. Since the arrest I have not been seen for an attorney, and I have not yet recieved any form of paperwork that involves my case.

Im having a very difficult time obtaining information on my case especially for the fact that Im only being housed in this facility and information provided to me is limited. Im asking for any information you may give me in regards to my case along with a possible court date and the process to obtain legal representation.

A timely response is greatly appreciated. Thank you for taking the time to read my letter and reviewing my file.
