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Subject: Tweet all about it: Teachers convene in Washington for social media course

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Teachers from around the country will be gathering in Washington, D.C., this weekend to get a crash course in using social media and other online educational tools in the classroom. The sixth annual Teachers Open House, hosted by The Newseum, will feature a Pennsylvania English teacher who until recently, knew little about Twitter, but uses it now to actively promote learning in her classroom. Annette Spahr told me in an interview that the social media tool has changed her life – and her students' lives. It totally changed the way her students read and reviewed "The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn," she told me. "My students are way up in the stratosphere using this material, and I really wanted to be able to use technology in the classroom to energize them," she said.

Spahr will impart the knowledge she gained about Twitter and other tools during a summer program at the news-focused Washington, D.C. museum at this weekend's event, aimed at helping other teachers incorporate Twitter assignments in their classes. Council Rock School District in Bucks County has implemented solutions from Ziften, which focuses on endpoint detection and response, and Lancope, which specializes in network visibility. The services cost \$140,000 total. The tech director for the district, Matthew Frederickson, told me that a new hobby for many middle school boys is to trigger these attacks, which can force all the computers in a building to go down. “Last year, we had a couple middle school students try to boot a machine off of a Lenox USB drive and run an application that would create a DDoS attack,” he said. “That would have

driven me nuts.” The services allow Frederickson to pinpoint exactly which computer the attack may be coming from.
