WACH: Emma's law brings tougher penalties for DUI convictions on October 1

new law aimed to stop repeat drunken drivers will take effect on October 1. The new law which requires interlocking devices on repeat DUI offender's vehicles is named after Emma Longstreet, a six-year-old Lexington girl who was killed by Billy Hutto, a repeat DUI offender on New Year's Day in 2012.

Note: "This is a bill that should be important to every parent in South Carolina," said Gov. Nikki Haley. "We're here today to do one of the most important things we can do – to protect our children."

Student test scores in Algebra I, Biology I and English I improved and were higher than the state average, but the scores in U.S. history were lower, District officials said in a press release.
